PROVISION OF THE LAW ON PAYMENT OF TAXES

Complicated System of Rebates And Penalties, Based on Date You Pungle.

March 15th you will be allowed a will bear interest at the rate of rebate of three per cent.

If you pay your taxes between March 15th and up to and including the first Monday, in April, there will not be any rebate, and neither will there be any penalty added.

If your taxes are not paid on or before the first Monday in April they will be added a penalty of ten per cent. and the tax will also draw interest at the rate of twelve per cent alty.

If you pay one-half of your taxes on or before the first Monday in in which the tax levy is made. April then the remaining half may run up to and including the first Monday in October following; but if the last half of tax due is not paid by the first Monday of October it becomes delinquent, and there will be added to such balance a penalty of such sale. - Democrat.

If you pay your taxes on or before ten per cent, and in addition such twelve per cent per annum from the first Monday in April until paid.

On all personal property taxes, if one-half is not paid on or before the first Monday in April, the law compels the sheriff to levy upon and collect the same after May 1st; hence to prevent a levy upon personal property after May 1st, it will be necessary will become delinquent, when there for one-half to be paid as above stated.
