Under the by laws of this organization, it becomes my duty as secretary to notify you that at 10:30 o'clock on the morning of August 22, 1904, the seventh annual session of the American Mining congress will convene in the city of Portland, Oregon.

The purpose of this organization is to advance the mining and metallurgical industries in all their various branches within the United States. To assist in bringing about a more perfect co-operation between the government of the United States and development of mining and metallurgy; to encourage education in practical and scientic mining and the disseminaton of scientic information metallic and non-metallic mining re sources of the United States; to promote a more co-operative tendency in the evolution of agriculture, mining, at the E. and E.
