RICH GOLD FIND ON GRAYBACK MOUNTAIN

The following story of a rich strike is sent out from Medford, this state, under a recent date:

William Gilmore, just in from Grayback Mountain, twenty miles east of Waldo, brings evidence of the greatest gold strike ever made ,in southern Oregon. He brought with him rock carrying 46 per cent gold.

The find was made by Harry Briggs. 18 years of age, while hunting deer. He broke a piece of ledge capping and mortared it, getting 700 pieces of gold, that weighed six pounds. C. J. Howard, David Briggs, Henry Briggs and Frank Thompson pounded out \$3,800 on Tuesday with an oldfashioned mortar.

A streak ten inches wide has been proved a distance on the surface of sixty feet, exposing 2,000 square feet of mineral. Miners are leaving for the new camp and there is greater ex citement than in the days of Gold

The scene of the strike is near the California line and on the divide between the Illinois and Klamath rivers, where great placer beds were found in the early days.
