Tice, of the Single Standard Geld Mining and Milling company, yesterday received the signed contracts by his company with large eastern capitalists, which insure the reopening and develop ment of this splendid property on a large scale, about the middle of the month. The property lies on Paddy creek, some twenty-five miles east of Baker City, and contains rich bodies of ore with better than averge values throughout the vein.

Contracts have also been signed up for the erection on the property at once of a modern, ten-stamp Allis & Chalmers mill, with all the concentrators, water-power machinery as well as electrical machinery for lighting the plant and mines and driving the power drills. The cost of the machinery to be put in at present is \$10,700, f. o. b. Baker City. Next year thirty stamps will be added to the mill.
