In line with the general railroad development of this Northwestern country was the completion of the railroad from Elgin to Enterprise, which affords an easy market for the Wallowa valley. The final terminus will be Joseph.

The Albany Apple Fair occupies the center of the stage in Oregon activities last week. Albany gave Portland, Eugene and Salem an object lesson in entertaining that it will take these cities a long time to equal. The town is growing and building hard surface pavements, while apples are equal to the best.

The Oregon State Dairy Association has been recognized by the Agricultural Department at Washington, D. C., and assurance is given that Government experts will participate in the convention on December 10th and 11th at Salem. A rate of fare and a third for the round trip has been made from all points in the State.

Kentucky stands today a disgrace to the eyes of the nation. Lawless bands of masked, midnight marauders rove over communities, burning and pillaging the property of others. Nor do they stop at crimes of malicious mischief, but do not hesitate to murder those who are defenseless, and in most cases innocent of any wrong. No wonder that Kentuckians abroad are ashamed to inform the public that they are from that disreputable and disgraced commonwealth.

Senator Bob Taylor of Tennessee was the prime factor in the downfall of Senator Carmack whose tragic death occurred a few days ago. After serving two terms as governor of that state, Taylor went upon the lecture platform and delivered lectures on such subjects as "Sentiment," "The Paradise of Fools," etc. Some people of the South thought it was great dope, but an Oregon audience would have hooted him off the platform. His next move was to get Carmack's seat in the Senate and succeeded in starting a political feud that ended in Carmack's death.

A night session will be held in the Convention Room on Tuesday, and a reception will be tendered to the delegates to both conventions on Thursday evening, December 3rd, by the Portland Commercial Club from 8 to 11 o'clock.
