Every person connected with the Liberty Loan campaigns during the last two years has had practically the same experience. Most of the people solicited to purchase bonds have treated the solicitors like honest men and women, but a certain small number have resented solicitation, often accusing the solicitors of chicanery, coercion or graft; of personal profit to the public detriment; of the whole gamut of almost everything from fierce criticism to plain "hold-ups". These un-American critics and fault-finders have made the work of the Loan workers hard. They made the Victory Loan, which should have been the easiest of all, the most difficult of all. The grumblers, the carpers, the critics, the tightwads and the slackers combined and re-doubled their efforts, but the Victory Loan came through with flying colors in spite of them.

The market roads meeting here Monday night was enthusiastic in its approval of the speaker's explanations of the five-year road-building schedule for Marion county. Practically everyone present indorsed the plan when the speaker called upon those who approved the project to stand up. The response was almost unanimous. If the same percentage of the people throughout the county favor the county road plans, the bonding measure will carry by a large majority.

Many of the patrons of the Aurora school are demanding that a play shed be provided for the children for a winter play-place and that the school grounds be enlarged for summer sports and games. Both are needed, and the district is abundantly able to provide both.

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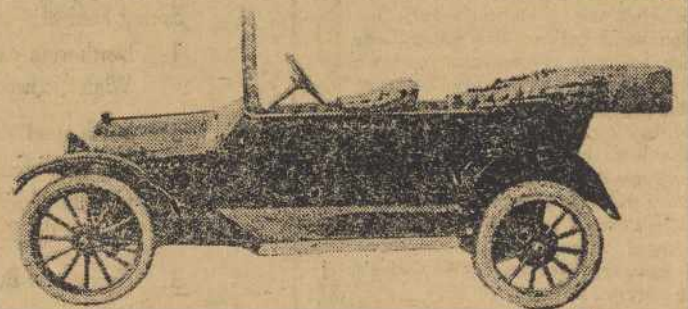
