

## A GOOD MEASURE

The Pythians of Tillamook are supporting the Roosevelt Highway measure unanimously and are appealing to all good citizens to support the measure as a matter of justice to the coast counties—all of which will remain practically isolated until such a Highway is built. This highway will open and develop the great natural resources of Western Oregon, and attract thousands of permanent residents to that section. It will bring investors, who will help to convert millions of idle acres into productive homes.

The Roosevelt Highway measure provides that the state shall issue \$2,500,000 in bonds, to be matched by the United States with an equal sum—to build a paved road through the coast counties north and south from the Columbia River to the California line. If the Federal government does not meet the state with an appropriation, the state bonds cannot be issued. If it does put up an amount equal to the state appropriation, Oregon will be getting a \$5,000,000 road for 50 cents on the dollar. This is good business, if there were no other reasons for approving the bill.

But there are other cogent reasons why the Roosevelt Highway should be built. Such a road means the commercial and agricultural development of all western Oregon. It will bring millions of dollars to Oregon from the "tourist crop". It will afford military security and defense again invasion in case of war. It will form a link in a great paved road from British Columbia to Mexico. It will contribute to the prosperity of all Oregon. Vote for the Roosevelt military Highway measure.

While there are some in Northern Marion county who oppose hard-surfaced roads and want macadam only, the adjacent parts of Clackamas county are prodding their county court for a paved highway from Canby to Molalla and beyond. They are not satisfied with anything less than the best, which they declare will be the cheapest in the long run.

Louis Helem came up from Salem Saturday to visit friends here. He returned Monday evening.

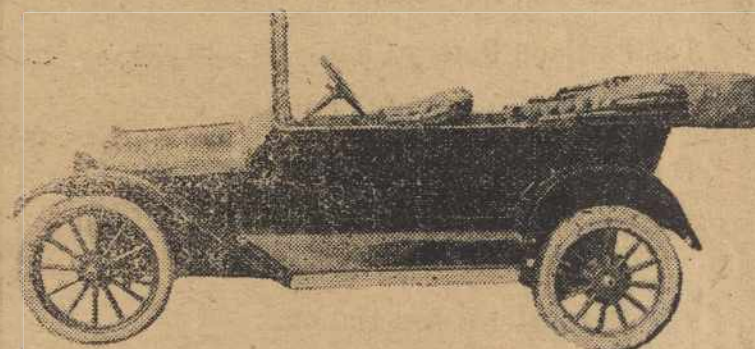
