## TYPIFIES TRIALS OF ISRAEL

"The Only Kid," Song-Story in Passover Services, Believed to Have That Significance.

Some commentators say that "The House That Jack Built" is only a jingle taken from "Chad Gadyoh," or "The Only Kid," a nursery doggerel, which later became a Jewish legend, observes the Detroit News. It has found its way into the "Hagadah," the Jewish book used the first two nights of the passover service of the Jewish people. After the service is over and the dinner eaten, the father sings aloud, "The Only Kid," with his children following him. Then he translates it into English or Yiddish for those of the family who do not understand Hebrew.

"The Only Kid" tells of a kid eaten by a cat; of a dog which bit the cat; of a stick that smote the dog; of a fire that burned the stick. Then it tells of water that extinguished the fire; of an ox that drank the water; of a butcher who killed the ox; of the angel of death who killed the butcher, and finally of God who killed the angel. The legend is supposed to represent Israel's trials, with Israel cast as "The Only Kid" and the butcher, the cat, dog, fire and the stick as his tormentors, who are in turn killed by God.

"The Only Kid" has a swing and lilt to it resembling "The House That Jack Built," which gives rise to the belief that the latter is copied from it. Some say the Jewish legend is an old German ballad sprung from a French song.

The Maple Grove Lumber company of Wilsonville has filed articles showing a capitalization of \$5000. The incorporators are J. P. Bartles, O.M. Johnson and Stanley Smith.

A number of Aurora people attended the North Marion County Presbyterian Sunday school rally Sunday at Woodburn. Among those who went were Mrs. B. F. Giesy and children, Miss Lizzie Will, Mrs. Clara Atkinson and sons, and Mrs. W. P. Wurster and children.

During the month of July the Standard Oil company sold over 2,650,000 gallons of gasoline, and 440,000 gallons of distillate in Oregon. The Union Oil company sold 550,000 gallons of gasoline and 86,000 gallons of distillate. The tax paid on these sales amounted to nearly 36,000.

The sawmill of Slyter & Eckerson, the largest in the Molalla district, was menaced Saturday night by a forest fire five miles east of Molalla. Fire Warden Ferguson was on the scene with every available fighter. J. Lee Erickson, one of the mill owners, took a large force of men from Canby to fight the flames.

Mrs. Wm. Gelbrich who was taken to the Oregon City hospital upon the advice of Dr. Giesy, for treatment and care for a severe case of nose-bleed, is reported better. The case was a bad one, and Mrs. Gelbrich had to be given an anesthetic before the nose could be packed to stop the bleeding. Her friends hope she may soon be well enough to return.

The county court is thinking of putting a paving plant at West Woodburn, but the road between here and Newberg will first be widened all the way 60 feet and in one point straightened, also the weak places will be built up. This work will begin about Sept. 1.—Woodburn Independent.

The deer season throughout Oregon will open September 1st this year and will continue opened until October 31st, according to an announcement by the state game warden. The only exception is in Union and Wallowa counties where the season will open on September 10th and close on November 10th. Heretofore, the season has opened on August 15th in District No. 1, which consists of all counties West of the summit of the Cascade Mountains. The season this year is uniform in both districts except in the two counties heretofore mentioned. The bag limit is two deer with horns which is the same as last year.
