## A REAL NUGGET



Over 1,200,000 pounds of sugar were unloaded from steamers in Portland Saturday and Monday, and 900,000 pounds more are reported due by rail in Portland today. That should help to relieve the sugar stringency in Aurora.

It required many hundred American policeman last week in New York City to "protect" an opera company producing German grand opera. Both police and the opera singers might have been better employed in unloading sugar from ships in New York harbor.

It is reported that "Bill" Cherrington, the veteran Salem piano man and ex-political manager for Alex La Follett, has taken J. F. Jones under his wing as an aspirant for Ben West's job as assessor. "Bill" has been on earth long enough (some 80 years) to know what he's up against.

Woodburn school district electors will vote upon the district budget next Saturday. The largest items out of a total of \$34,000, are the following: Teacher's salaries \$18,000, bonds and interest \$3,925, outstanding warrants \$6,830. The amount to be raised by a district tax is \$23,571. Woodburn is never niggardly in support of its schools and the budget is certain to be adopted.

Governor Olcott still declines to accede to the wishes of the National Woman's party—to call a special session of the Oregon Legislature to ratify the woman suffrage amendment to the Federal constitution. Oregon public sentiment does not appear at this time to demand a special session for the above (or any other) purpose.

Several candidates for the presidency will probably appear upon the Oregon primary ballot next May. The candidates for the Republican nomination who may ask the indorsement of Oregon Republicans are Wm. H. Taft, Leonard Wood, Warren G. Harding, J. E. Watson, Miles Poindexter, Frank O. Lowden, and Hirman W. Johnson. Those whose names may appear on the democratic primary ballot are W. G. McAdoo, A. Mitchell Palmer, and possibly Woodrow Wilson.

December 1 to 10, the Red Cross seals will be on sale throughout Oregon, for the benefit of the state tuberculosis association. Oregon's quota of the Christmas seals is \$44,260, every cent of which will be used in Oregon in behalf with those afflicted with tuberculosis. The spirit of service is abroad in the land. The war taught us the value of happiness and service to country and to fellowmen. Hence the little Red Cross Christmas stickers and their mission will not be overlooked the first ten days of December.

Jim Stewart, of Fossil and Corvallis, member of the legislature and road booster, is about to file an initiative petition to have placed on the ballot a bill to allow the state to issue bonds up to 6% of its assessed valuation, instead of two per cent as at present. The limit of the state's indebtedness is about \$20,000,000. Stewart's proposal would increase the amount allowed to about \$60,000,000. All of which shows that the Hon. James S. Stewart of Fossil, Corvallis and Oregon is no piker.

Last week five days elapsed in Oregon City without a single arrest by the police! Even the lightning arresters were idle. Some town!

The open season for deer and china pheasants closes in this part of the state tomorrow night, but black cats, cur dogs, and alien slackers may be hunted the year round.
