Schools Get More Money

Marion county school apportionments have been made by superintendent Smith. The per capita apportionment of state funds amounts to \$1.95, and of county funds to \$5.32, a total per capita of \$7.27, or \$97,-423. 17 for the county.

Salem received \$29,000, Silverton \$7,000, Woodburn \$4,000 Hubbard \$2,000, Jefferson \$1,700.

Many districts have been without funds, and have had to pay interest on the warrants issued.


