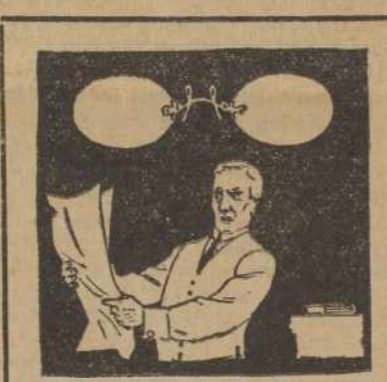

ORDINANCE NO. 112

Entitled an ordinance authorizing the Mayor and the Recorder of the City of Aurora, Oregon to enter into a contract with some responsible well driller to drill a deep well for the City of Aurora, Oregon.

The people of the City of Aurora do ordain as follows:

That the Mayor and the Recorder of the city of Aurora are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with some responsible well driller for boring an eight inch diameter deep water well for the City of Aurora. Said contract to be for eight inch standard pipe to be put in the ground to such a depth as the common council may direct. The price for drilling and pipe not to exceed six dollars (\$6.00) per foot.
