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More Deadly Than War

A circular issued by A. T. Mercier, superintendent of the Southern Pacific at Portland contains the startling declaration that at the rate we are going now, the accidental deaths in America would wipe the population of Portland completely off the map in a little over 3 years.

He says also that our industries and our traffic on the highways, purely peaceful pursuits, were responsible for over three times as many deaths during the 19 months we were at war as met death on the battlefields of Europe or died from wounds. During those 19 months the war cost us 47,949 lives, while accidents at home caused 156,000 lives.

Doesn't that situation drive home the thought embodied in the Southern Pacific slogan of "Safety First?" Our railroads and electric railways are doing their level best to reduce the number of these public accidents, but the general public does not awaken to the fact that carelessness is more deadly than war.
