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The Gasoline Problem

The American Petroleum Institute, an association of oil men, has addressed a letter to the 5000 members of society of automotive engineers, saying that the gasoline problem must be solved by the automotive engineer, through the building of engines that give four times the mileage of present engines.

The oil men demand that the horse power of heavy cars be cut down and that speed be reduced to 25 miles an hour. They declare that the amount of fuel cannot be greatly increased, hence a more efficient use of fuel is the only remedy in sight.

Railroad Income

Many people are under the impression that the government guarantees the railroads an income of 6 per cent. This is an error. The government guarantees the railroads nothing. The Transportation Act (The Esch-Cummins bill) authorizes the Inter-State Commerce Commission to make rates with a fair return on the value of the railroad property used in the service of the public. The Commission has fixed rates which it hopes will produce revenue sufficient to allow the railroads 5 1/2 per cent on their investment, but neither the commission nor the transportation act guarantees any rate of return whatever to stockholders.

DAIRY NOTES

Regularity in feeding dairy stock is important.

Keep the cans of cream in a cooling tank until time of delivery.

Skim the milk as soon after making as possible and cool the cream at once.

A cow must have a certain amount of food nutrients to keep up the flow of milk.

Protect the cans of cream from the sun by covering with canvas or with a wet sack while en route.
