U'Ren Opposes Four Per Cent Ammendment

A letter from U. S. U'Ren of Portland to the Observer says:

Dear Mr. Wescott:—
"A few days ago a friend sent me a copy of your paper, which accuses me of supporting the four per cent interest constitutional amendment. I am not guilty and never was; I have never said anything that would justify the charge.

The adoption of this amendment would be a calamity for the people of Oregon. Hundreds of such laws have been tried, and always increased the burdens of the farmers and wage workers. The rates of interest can be reduced by increasing the supply of money for loans on safe security faster than the demand increases, and not in any other way. Congress could do this, but it is beyond the power of any state.

I hope you will give this letter as prominent space as you gave the false charge, and I forgive you this time because you are a friend of mine, but please do not accuse me again of doing anything so foolish as advocating a

Gordon Watt was a business visitor in Portland Tuesday.

Mrs. A. D. Yergen and Mr. and Mrs. Glen Yergen were here from East Butteville Saturday.

Governor Olcott has designated October 9, 1920 as "Fire Prevention Day", on which he urges all Oregon householders to inspect their premises for fire hazards. He also asks that exercises on fire prevention be held in all schools, and that the press and the pulpit give the subject special attention.

John Pugh Sr. states that the Pugh hop yard of 13 acres produced 65,000 pounds of hops, which when baled should produce the 16,000 lbs. which the Pughs have contracted to Henry L. Bents for Strauss & Co. of London. John says he is seventy two years young but is still able to help raise a bumper hop crop. The Pughs next year expect a crop twice as large from the same acreage. Their hops are contracted for 3 years—43c for 1920, 33c for 1921, and 29c for 1922.

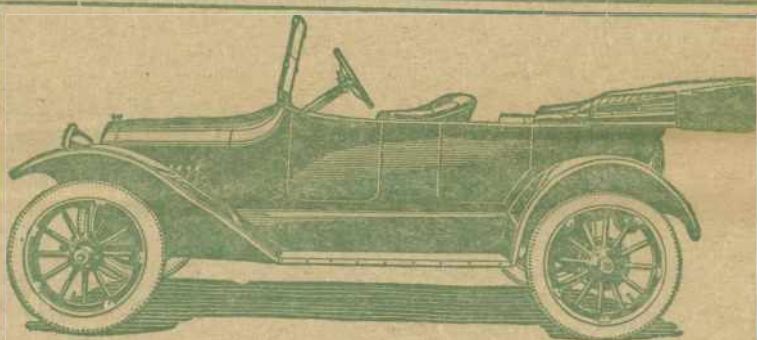

Fire Destroys Hop House

Hop kilns and store rooms belonging to Julius Pincus, at Hopville, south of Independence were destroyed by fire last week. The buildings carried \$4000 insurance in the Hop Growers Fire Relief Association of Butteville, and probably more in old line companies. The hops destroyed were also insured. This is the only loss of any size the Butteville-Association has sustained this season, though a small roof fire on the Thielson place, Hubbard Route 1, caused a small loss.

Very few hop house fires have been reported this year in any section. The Pincus store rooms contained the hops from his 40-acre yard at Hopville.
