
Some Deer Hunters

Film Shows Treatment of Flock at Culling Time in Fall and on to Selling of Lambs.

four reels. About 45 minutes is required for the showing of the whole production.


The subject treated in the first and second reel is a year with the flock on the farm, beginning in the fall at the time that the ewe flock should be and Ashland camp grounds were the culled prior to breeding, and carrying it on through until the lambs are sold. Each seasonal practice is brought out and educational points are featured. The third reel deals with the co-opera-

tive marketing of wool and lambs, and the fourth reel with the slaughtering of a mutton sheep, dressing the carcass, and then cutting it up for meat consumption.

MEAT SUPPLIES FOR FAMILY

Greater Portion of Pork Products Used by Farmers Are Produced on Home Farm.

Nearly two-thirds of the meat eaten on the farm is pork, the average farm consumption of pork being over 500 pounds per family.
