Recent guests at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Phil Wiegand at South Paradise were Mr. and Mrs. Frank Tyler, Miss Cordia Wiegand, Mr. and Mrs. Chas. Glaze, Mrs. Clara Snyder and Miss Etter of Salem.

Fritz and Bertha Stegmann of Needy have filed suit at Oregon City against J. P. Linder and T. W. Williams to collect a promissory note for \$400, given March 30, 1918. The Stegmanns allege that Linder and Williams have failed to pay the interest and ask that a mortgage to secure the note be foreclosed.

The Oregon Tuberculosis Association is organizing its forces for the sale of Christmas Seals. They hope to sell 4,500,000 seals which will raise \$45,000 for carrying on the work of caring for hundreds of Oregon victims of the dread disease, and for combating tuberculosis by vital educational, demonstrative and experimental work.

The four miles of shell-holes, craters, and trenches between Aurora and Canby has led to the abandonment of the Lee auto stage between Canby and Woodburn until a more favorable condition prevails. Mr. Lee may, however, decide to make schedule trips between Aurora and Salem, stopping at intermediate points.

It is reported that Yakima Valley hop houses and contents, valued at \$50,000, have been burned since hop picking. Three of them were destroyed in one night last week. The hop houses were in widely separated districts, which leads to the suspicion that the buildings may have been set on fire. It is said the 1920 Yakima Valley hop crop approximates 4,000,000 pounds (about 20,000 bales).

## Dr. Harvey W. Wiley Says "Vote 313 No"

Speaking before the Members' Forum of the Portland Chamber of Commerce, Dr. Wiley, formerly head of the Government's pure food bureau and known as the "Father of the Pure Food Laws," declared that the title of the bill was a misnomer and that it should be called "a bill for the increase in mortality in children."

"Never before have I been in a community where matters pertaining to public health have been taken out of the hands of experts and put to a vote before the people," declared Dr. Wiley. "I do not think that a parent in this state who has children of school age will vote for this measure, because it means that the school children will not be protected against contagious diseases."
