Several wage reductions have been made recently in Salem. The Kay Woolen Mills cut wages from 15 to 18 per cent. The Spalding Logging Co. cut wages 13 per cent and now comes the Valley Motor Co. with a 10 per cent cut. The Phez Company also cut 10 per cent off their employes wages, and other companies are said to be considering similar reductions.

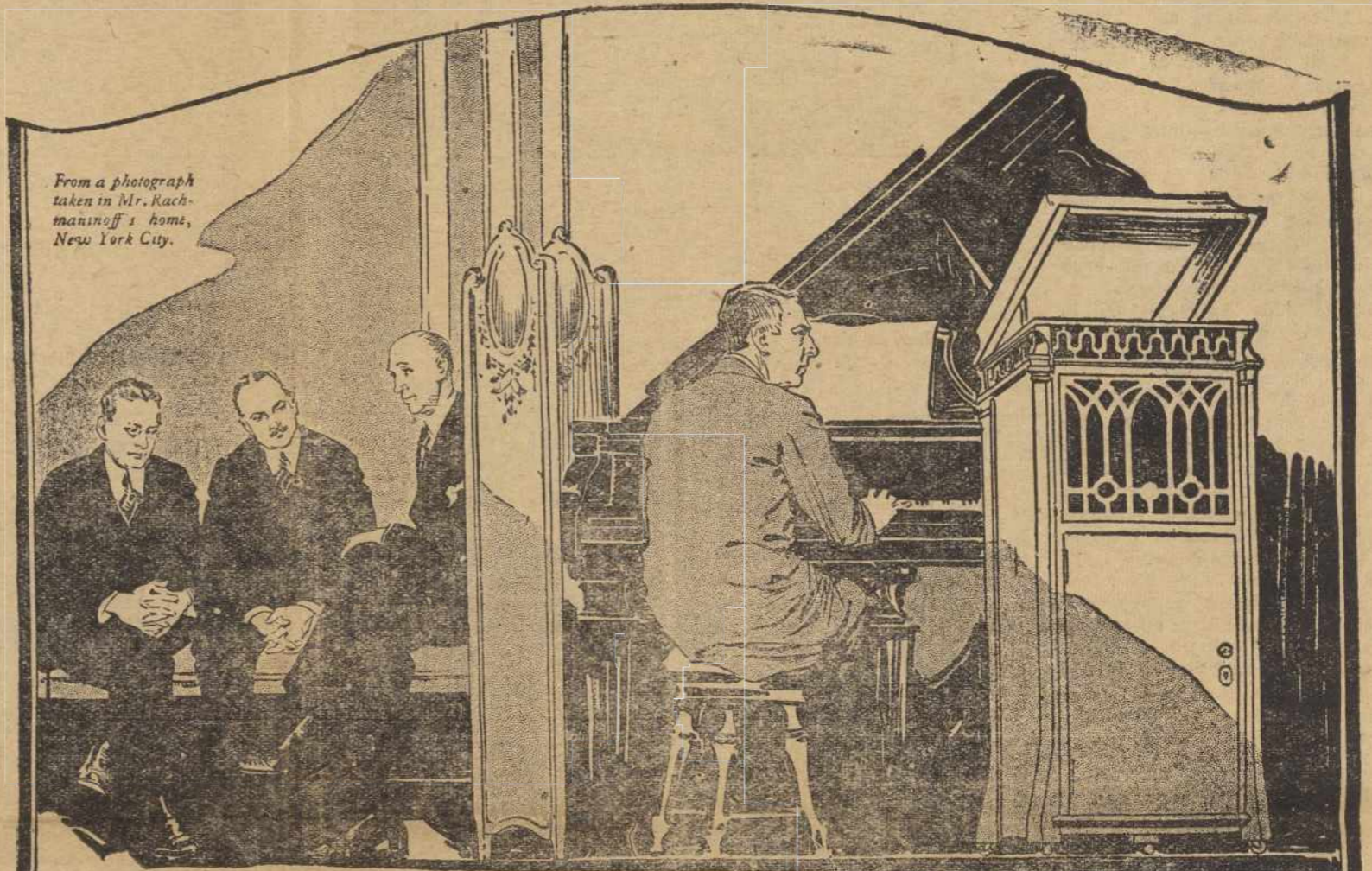
