DOCTRINE AND CONDUCT.

In these days when there is so much dispute about doctrine, creed, opinion, faith, etc., it is strange that people don't go to the Bible (St. John 7:17) and read: "If any man do his will he shall know of the doctrine." That is the only way to discover the doctrine. You cannot communicate it; you cannot argue it into a man, you cannot furnish him a faith by word. It is the life that tells.
