An Appeal For Ireland

Sixteen centuries have passed since St. Patrick, the gracious, gentle and appealing missionary and great apostle of the Irish Race, converted pagan Ireland to Christianity. He accomplished his work, not as a warrior, not in military pomp and splendor, but in the meek and lowly garb of a follower of Jesus Christ. Yet today sixteen hundred years after St. Patrick's benign mission, Ireland is drinking the dregs of human suffering, internecine, war famine and disease threaten to overwhelm the Irish people.

"It is not our purpose to fix the cause of these awful conditions, but point out the necessity of alleviating this suffering," says the "Oregon State Committee for the relief of Ireland." The committee's appeal is solely humanitarian, absolutely non-sectarian and strictly non-political. No question of race, religion or politics should be the alleviation of human misery.

The State Committee (522 Selling Building, Portland) appeal to you for aid, in the faith that the American people will not allow famine and plague to overwhelm the Irish Race.

Silverton is putting on metropolitan airs. It wants free city mail delivery and has made application to the postmaster-general for that service. Silverton has made rapid progress and is now the second city in Marion county in size and the first in aspirations.

As long as a large part of the American people are more intent upon getting as much as possible for a given service instead of how much can be done in a given time, there is small chance of this country making progress and a rapid recovery from the effects of the war.

This is "Fix-It" week—the time set apart by machinery manufacturers to repair machinery of all kinds and "fix" them up for service. This year, more than ever before, it is necessary to economize and to save expense. Repairing the machinery now will avoid loss later.

Cleaning the streets, repairing the side walks and crosswalks, burning the trash, cleaning-up and painting-up generally, planting flowers on the curbing, and refraining from littering the streets with paper and other trash are inexpensive ways of city advertising that bring valuable results; and Aurora needs this kind of advertising. A clean town attracts more and brings more benefits than a bushel of talk.

Many high schools throughout the country are giving practical training in farm shop problems, including practical studies in wood, concrete and iron. The purpose of farm shop training is to prepare the boy for repair and construction work on the ordinary farm. The instruction given is based upon actual farm experience and the needs of the community. This kind of high school training has an important value beyond its mere mastering of tools. It develops the student's initiative, awakens a spirit of co-operation, and enlarges the pupil's power to plan and execute honest work essential to community progress and individual success.
