What constitutes liberal and sufficient Store Publicity has caused more debate than anything outside the halls of congress.

Why some Merchants in the smaller cities of the nation view Advertising with so much distrust is more than we can understand.

Newspaper Advertising has been proven thoroughly profitable in the large metropolitan centers and an intelligent reason why it will not obtain as good results in smaller communities has never been advanced to date. AND IT NEVER WILL.

A Merchant's advertising experience which has not been successful is due entirely to just two conditions:
