A QUESTION ANSWERED

We have talked with a good many merchants in the past, and among them we have struck several who frankly stated that they started to advertise once but it didn't pay as they figured it would, so they became discouraged and quit. Always they've asked the reason, and always it was hard to make them understand, to convince them exactly WHY their advertising failed. But now comes Herbert Casson, well-known writer and publicity expert, with an article in an eastern magazine which seems to answer the question. He says:

"The man who runs an ad, no matter how convincing it is, and then stops at salesmanship in the store, isn't going to get his money's worth from the advertisement. Neither is the man who runs one ad, who makes a sudden loud noise and then drops into dead silence. That kind of man sends his advertising up like a skyrocket—it is seen for a moment and forgotten. The wise advertiser follows up the first ad with another, and then still more and, like a lighthouse his ads stand there to guide the public, and their light can be seen all the time. You have to tell some people a fact two or three times before they will believe it.

"After all, advertising is only sowing the seed. After the soil and the sun and the rain have done their best, then comes the harvesting. You must reap, and stack, and thresh, and bag and sell. And also you must remember that the other man will get the business if you don't ask for it."

MAN ASKS AND GOD ANSWERS QUESTIONS ON SIN'S PENALTY

What is the penalty of Sin?

Gen. 2: 17: But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil thou shalt not eat. . . . In the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die. Jer. 31: 30: Every one shall die for his own iniquity. Rom. 1: 32: They which commit such things are worthy of death. Rom. 5: 12, 15, 17: Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin. Through the offense of one many be dead. By one man's offense death reigned by one.

1 Cor. 15: 21, 22: By man came death; . . . for all in Adam die. Rom. 6: 16: To whom ye yield yourselves servants to obey his servants ye are to whom ye obey, whether of sin unto death.

Rom. 6: 21, 23: The end of those things is death. The wages of sin is death. Rom. 7: 5: The motions of sins . . . did work in our members to bring forth fruit unto death. 1 Cor. 15: 56: The sting of death is sin. Jas. 1: 15: When lust hath conceived, it bringeth forth sin; and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death. 1 John 5: 16: There is a sin unto death.

Job 36: 14 (margin): Their soul dieth in youth; and their life is among the unclean. Ps. 56: 13, 116: 8: Thou hast delivered my soul from death. Ps. 78: 50: He spared not their soul from death. Is. 53: 10, 12: Thou shalt make His soul an offering for sin. He hath poured out His soul unto death. Ezek. 18: 4, 20: The soul that sinneth, it shall die. Jas. 5: 20: He which converteth the sinner from the error of his way shall save a soul from death. Matt. 26: 38: My soul is exceeding sorrowful, even unto death.

What Scriptures show that Death as sin's penalty is not life?

Deut. 30: 15, 19: I have set before thee this day life and good, and death and evil. I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing; therefore choose life, that both thou and thy seed may live. Rom. 5: 21: That as sin hath reigned unto death, even so might grace reign through righteousness unto eternal life. Rom. 6: 23: For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life. Rom. 8: 13: For if ye live after the flesh ye shall die; but if ye through the Spirit do mortify the deeds of the body, ye shall live.

Ps. 22: 29: None can keep alive his own soul. Ps. 33: 18, 19: Behold, the eye of the Lord is upon them that fear him, . . . to deliver their soul from death, and to keep them alive. Ezek. 13: 9: And will ye pollute Me among My people for handfuls of barley and for pieces of bread, to slay the souls that should not die, and to save the souls alive that should not live? Is. 55: 3: Come unto me; hear, and your soul shall live.

What Scriptures show that death as sin's penalty means cutting off?

Ps. 37: 9, 22, 34: Evil doers shall be cut off. They that be cursed of Him shall be cut off. The wicked are cut off. Lev. 22: 3: Whosoever . . . goeth unto the holy things, . . . having his uncleanness upon him, that soul shall be cut off. Num. 15: 30: But the soul that doeth aught presumptuously, . . . the same reproacheth the Lord; and that soul shall be cut off.

What Scriptures show that death as sin's penalty means perishing?

Job 4: 9: By the blast of God they perish, and by the breath of His wrath they are consumed. Job 6: 15: My brethren have dealt deceitfully, . . . as the streams of brooks they pass away. . . . They go to nothing, and perish. Ps. 73: 27: For lo, they that are far from Thee shall perish. Thou hast destroyed all them that go . . . from Thee. Prov. 11: 10: The wicked shall perish. John 3: 16: For God so loved the world that He gave His Only Begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life. Ps. 37: 20: The wicked shall perish, and the enemies of the Lord shall be as the fat of lambs; they shall consume; into smoke shall they consume away.

What Scriptures show that death as sin's penalty means devouring?

Is. 1: 20: But if ye refuse and rebel, ye shall be devoured. Heb. 10: 26, 27: For if we sin wilfully after that we have received the knowledge of the truth, there remaineth no more sacrifice for sins, but a certain fearful looking for of judgment and fiery indignation, which shall devour the adversaries. Ezek. 22: 25: There is a conspiracy of her prophets in the midst thereof, like a roaring lion ravaging the prey, they have devoured souls.

What Scriptures show that death as sin's penalty means consuming?

Ps. 104: 35: Let the sinners be consumed out of the earth and let the wicked be no more. Is. 1: 28: And the destruction of transgressors and of the sinners shall be together, and they that forsake the Lord shall be consumed. Heb. 12: 29: For our God is a consuming fire. Is. 10: 18: He shall consume . . . both soul and body.

A Foolish Proposition

It will be another proof that Oregon is the fool of the family of western states if the people adopt a state income tax. With high property taxes, backed by political machinery in high gear and operated with taxpayers' money, state income tax is silly. Federal income taxes and internal revenue taxes are eating up business incomes now and a state income tax is economic folly. All the leaders in the movement are persons without incomes and pay no property taxes, run no business, employ no labor, and live mostly or entirely off the taxpayer and producer. Of course, they favor a state income tax because they have no responsibility of any kind, and have nothing to lose. But they would all get a job. POOR OLD OREGON

Poor Oregon! Naturally one of the richest states in natural resources, it is politically one of the worst crucified and slowest developing states in the West. The political inventions on the ballot will all swell the army of officialism and increase the burdens of taxation to enrich those who live off industry and production. If Oregon could be thrown open to capital to come in and develop the state on the easiest terms, and if taxes could be reduced about 25 per cent, there would be a great future for the state. On top of all the socialistic buncombe there are laws proposed to create race hatred and arouse religious bigotry, that will divide the people for all time to come, keep others from coming to the state and drive others out. The political nightmare that haunts the sleep of the average Oregonian ought to wake him up to the realization that experimenting with freak propositions will ruin any state or business. Other western states face radical taxation schemes. Let the people think twice before committing industrial and financial suicide by preventing investment of capital and employment of labor.
