Hunters Are The Finest of Sportsmen

The six millions of dollars they paid for licenses this season is the smallest item.

"That more than six million dollars have been paid into various state treasuries by hunters of large and small game this fall is something that everyone does not know," said Mr. G. A. Ehlen, the local Winchester dealer, yesterday.

"This six million," continued Mr. Ehlen, "is only a small portion of the money these sportsmen spend for the pleasure of seeking game. The license is the least expensive thing that has to be procured, but it is something that is absolutely necessary. It is also necessary for one to have a good gun, the best of ammunition, the necessary clothing, etc., if one is going to hunt with comfort. We have done a bigger business in sportsman's supplies this year than ever before and I understand that the same situation is being experienced by dealers all over the United States.

"That those who hunt in the field are sportsmen in every sense of the word is proven by answers to a number of telegrams recently sent out by the Portland, (Ore.) Chamber of Commerce requesting to know the amount of money sportsmen spent in various places. The Maine Commissioner of Fish and Game replied that from \$30,000,000 to \$50,000,000 were left in Maine yearly by those who hunt and fish; from Florida came word that \$250,000,000 were left there by sportsmen each year; Wisconsin placed the figures at \$3,000,000; Denver at \$20,000,000 and San Francisco at \$11,000,000. These scattered points give a total of \$315,000,000. The Portland Chamber of Commerce wanted these answers to refute any argument that it doesn't pay to cater to sportsmen.

"With game more plentiful now than it has been for many years, with wise conservation measures being put in force, with the United States Government very much interested in the game in every state, it does pay every city and state to cater to sportsmen. The States that spent money yearly to breed game, that spends money on game preserves and stocks them get a lot of money back for its citizens for the sportsmen will go there to hunt and they will spend money in traveling. This has been one of the greatest hunting seasons on record. Those who have not already spent some time in the field had better go at once."

Nation's Meat Consumption Big.
Washington, D. C.—The department of commerce in a statement estimated that the per capita consumption of meat in the United States will exceed 150 pounds this year.

The Scramble for Tax-Exemption

The agitation which is developing all over the country to amend our present laws so as to prevent the further issuance of tax-exempt bonds is causing increased demand for those issues.

Investors are snapping up all that can be had in the hope of getting as much of their money as possible into securities from which the income derived is exempted from taxation.

This merely emphasizes the evil effect of having some \$30,000,000, 000 of this class of securities outstanding which have absorbed money on the income from which taxes would otherwise be paid.

It is only a question of time when remedial legislation must be passed for with tax-exempt issues increasing at the present rate (some \$2,000,000,000 for 1922), in ten years' time our public debt would be increased in an amount equal to that caused by the world war.

It is change our laws or bankrupt the taxpayer.—Industrial News Bureau.
