What Can be Done on 17 Acres.

The following tale, clipped from the Woodburn Independent, is a good boost for Woodburn and an equally good boost for Aurora, for have we not just as good soil and just as good climate. Auroraites know Joseph Nibler and many of them know his place near Woodburn:

The Slogan editor of the Statesman recently inserted the following in an article on nuts and fruits:

A fine illustration of the idea which Mr. Pearey was attempting to set forth is given in a concrete, practical way by the experience of Joseph Nibler, living near Newberg but claimed by the Woodburn boosters as being in their district.

Mr. Nibler has a 17-acre farm that is so diversified in its products as to set a new and strange mark for the Willamette valley.

At a meeting of berry growers last winter at Woodburn, he reported his sales for 1922 as follows:

Raspberries, \$750; strawberries, \$638; walnuts, \$128; filberts, \$438; evergreens, \$694; gooseberries, \$378; filbert plants, gooseberry cuttings, \$35; raspberry plants, \$30; strawberry plants, \$32; evergreen tips, \$12; corn \$9; kraut, \$8; miscellaneous vegetables, \$40; a total revenue of \$4,879.32 for his 17-acre farm.

Mr. Nibler is an enthusiast for diversified farming, as shown by his report of good cash sales on 18 varieties of products in one season. He looks on the filbert, however, as one of the best of all products for the Willamette valley, and his own 1922 report shows that almost one-half of his total revenue was from nuts and nut products. He was listened to with the closest attention, by those who attended the meeting, as a successful grower who knows where the money is and how to get it.

The greatest poet this world ever knew expressed this truth racy in the words: "How weary, stale, flat, and unprofitable seem to me all the uses of this world."

What can you buy with money? Just reflect and figure it out for yourself? In the last analysis only those things which you could get along without and be happy still. But the things that make your life worth living, the things that affect the soul, can not be bought with gold.

You can not buy love. You can not buy honor. You can not buy happiness. You can not buy the respect of your fellowmen. Eldon Parson, in Churchill's "The Inside of the Cup," was a man of great wealth, but he could not even command the devotion of his children. He lived in a house with a score or so of chambers spacious and grand, but he felt lonesome.

And so you cannot buy sound judgment or wisdom; neither can you buy knowledge or health. And if you are no poet, all the money in this world will not purchase for you poetic fire, the power of imagination, the winged word.

Money has but a little world to operate in; the highest gifts can not be bought with gold. The truly wise look upon money as but a means, not an end. They will not permit money to enslave them, but jealously see to it that they remain the masters of their soul.
