Oregon walnuts this year are of higher quality than ever before, according to reports received at the offices of the Oregon Growers Co-opersaid that practically all of the 1923 crop has been contracted, at prices satisfactory to the producers.

Sufficient digging of the main crop of Oregon potatoes had been done by November 1 to indicate that the average size of the tubers will be much below normal, which will reduce both yield per acre and percentage of marketable tubers. In some fields the potatoes are so small that the crop will probably not be dug.
