Senator McNary Will Carry State

Portland, Oregon, May 14.—"United States Senator Charles L. McNary will carry Multnomah county by 5,000 votes and his lead in the up-state will bring his plurality for the state up to at least 30,000," declared E. M. Page, campaign manager for Senator McNary today, after a careful survey of the situation in all sections of the state.

"This forecast is based upon reports from every county and section of the state and I feel that I am taking a conservative view in making this prediction. Up to about six weeks ago our principal opponents, Mayor Baker and Speaker K. K. Kubli, were making considerable headway and some inroads in Senator McNary's support. Developments of the past month, however, have overcome this influence and the Senator has been making steady and cumulative gains throughout the state. This is particularly true of Multnomah county, where Senator McNary is acknowledged to be the favorite and is gaining strength daily.

"Senator McNary's campaign has been conducted along educational and constructive lines; strictly in keeping with his pre-campaign announcement, and solely upon his record of achievements during his seven years of service in the Senate. Oregon's representation in Congress is a serious matter at this critical stage of the state's future development and I feel that the people have arrived at the conclusion that Senator McNary has given them the very best of service, and in the language of Senator Moses of New Hampshire, 'Senator McNary has accomplished more during his term of office than any other Western Senator.'

"As chairman of the committee on Irrigation and Reclamation, of the sub-committee on Agriculture, the joint committee on Agricultural appropriations, the select committee on Reforestation and the select committee on Crop Insurance, as ranking member on the committee on Agriculture and Forestry, the only representative of the entire West of the committee on Commerce on the committee on Rivers and Harbors appropriations, member of the joint commission on Agricultural Inquiry, committee on Committees, Manufactures and Indian Affairs, all affecting the most vital interests of Oregon, Senator McNary is in position to protect Oregon's every interest and secure a just share of government funds for the development of the state's resources and industries.

"Oregon has been remarkably fortunate in the matter of Senator McNary's membership and rapid advancement on committees of the first magnitude, by reason of which Oregon has received more than any other Western State in federal aid to industrial development since he took his seat in the Senate. I feel that the people are satisfied with what Senator McNary has accomplished and that he is in position to secure for the state greater things in the future and are not willing to sacrifice the prestige he has gained for the State for experiment with a new and inexperienced man. They feel that the State's progress would remain at a standstill until a new Senator could attain Senator McNary's present status, which would take years."

"Fairness to all" has been the watchword of Oscar A. Steelhammer, Marion county assessor, and it is upon this record that he will become a candidate for a second term.
