March 2, 1916

Onion growers expect to make a quick clean-up of the 1915 crop this spring, there now being only 100 cars of good Oregon stock in the hands of producers.

The Aurora warehouse is full of hops, new lots coming in about as fast as old ones shipped out. About 1000 bales are now on hand.

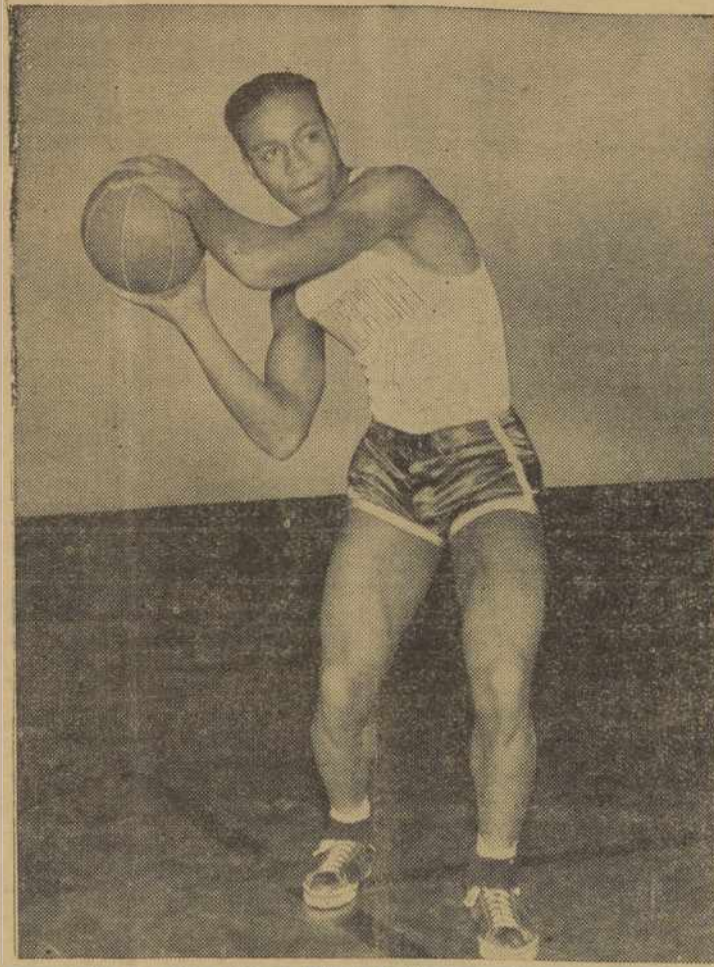
