NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at the School District No. 48 Bond Election hereby called to be held at the Beaverton High School, in and for School District No. 48 of Washington County, Oregon, on Friday the Third day of May, 1929, between the hours of two o'clock P. M. and seven o'clock P. M., there will be submitted to the legal voters thereof the question of contracting a bonded indebtedness in the sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) for the purpose of remodeling the present High School Building and erecting and equipping an addition to the said High School Building.

The vote to be by ballot upon which shall be the words "Bonds-Yes" and "Bonds-No"; and the voter shall place a cross (X) between the words "Bonds" and the word "Yes" or between the words "Bonds" and the word "No", which indicates his choice.
