## COUNTY AGENT NOTES

### Poultry Branding Appears Feasible

This past week a system of tattooing poultry with a registered brand was investigated by Wm. F. Cyrus, assistant county agent. Mr. Cyrus found that a number of Yamhill county farmers are already using a system of tattooing poultry which identifies the poultry so marked and enables anyone to trace such poultry to the original owner.

Each county of the state has a serial letter and the serial letter for Washington county is W. Each poultryman who wishes to brand his poultry with a registered brand uses the W and follows this with his registered number.

Poultrymen may have their own private brands registered by the livestock sanitary board for a charge of 50 cents when such applications are handled in lots through the county agent's office.

Any poultryman may select such numbers as are yet unassigned and record of assigned numbers will be kept in the county agent's office.

Arrangements have been made to secure a tattooing machine to be kept in the county agent's office at Hillsboro, the same to be loaned out to poultrymen at a charge of 25 cents per day and 50 cents per day after the second day until returned. A deposit of \$5 will be required when the machine is taken from the office.

The tattoo marks are made in the web of the wing. It is said that cannot be removed except the portion tattooed is removed.

### Apple and Pear Scab:

Scab is the most serious disease of the apple and pear in western Oregon and Washington. The organism responsible for the disease is carried over on the old last year's leaves. These leaves should be plowed or disked in each spring before the buds burst, and by all means before full bloom.

Dormant sprays are of no value in controlling scab. Early summer sprays are absolutely necessary.

The first scab spray should be 500 birds can be tattooed in half a day. It is said that the tattoo marks applied just as the newly formed leaves are separating enough to expose the blossom and cluster, using lime-sulphur 3 1/2 gallons to the 100 gallon tank.

This should be followed by a second spray of lime-sulphur 2 1/2 gallons to the hundred, just before the blossoms open.

Lime-sulphur 2 1/2 gallons to hundred added to the calyx should be followed by another of lime-sulphur 2 gallons to one hundred, fifteen days later.

Seasons when wet weather comes rather late a fifth scab spray should be applied to the blossoms fifteen days after the fourth spray, using the same concentration of lime-sulphur.

Thoroughness of application, covering leaves, leaf stem, blossoms, blossom stems, small fruit and stems completely in each of the recommended spray is of importance.

Non-caustic sulphur sprays should be used on the tender skinned varieties of pears, especially for the second later sprays.

Persistence and accuracy in carrying out this program is necessary. Good control be obtained in 1928.
