Mrs. Paul Hagg and children returned from the coast last week. We understand that Mr. Hagg never went with them as was reported last week

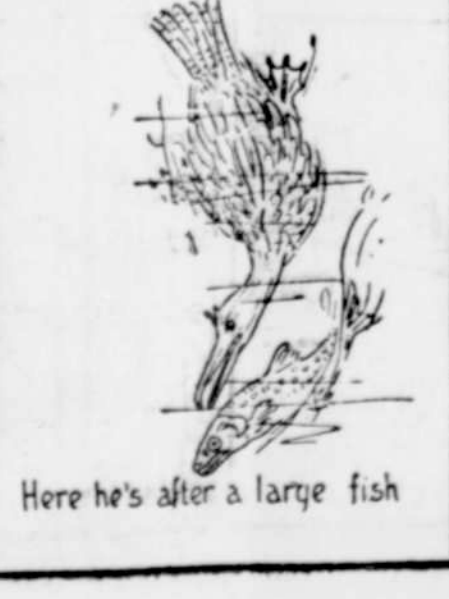
