BIGGEST RODEO IN
WESTERN OREGON

The stage is set in Oregon City
for the biggest rodeo ever staged
in western Oregon and next Tues-
day, Wednesday and Thursday,
July 2, 3, and 4, will see scores of
cowboys, cowgirls and Indians com-
peting for the \$100,000 in prizes of-
fered by the Oregon City Frontier
Days. The show is sponsored by the
American Legion.

Programs presented each after-
noon at 1:30 and in the evening at
7:30, will feature broncho busting,
bulldogging, calf roping, stage coach
races, wild horse races, pony ex-
press, chuck wagon races, pony ex-
and cowgirl relay races, Roman
stand races, war bonnet races,
squat races and many other
events. Four Pacific coast cham-
pionship contests are on the pro-
gram, each offering \$1000 in prizes.

Some of the best talent in the
United States will be seen in ac-
tion in Oregon City, including Ma-
bel Strickland, world's champion
cowgirl; Hugh Strickland, arena
director; Buff Brady, world's cham-
pion trick rider; Homer Hokum,
famous clown of Madison Square Gar-
den; Tex Covey, noted fancy roper;
Rose Smith, Pat and Ed Woods,
Earl Thode, Pat Owens, Bob As-
kins and many other famous rodeo
people.

On the night of July 4, after the
night show, there will be a \$4000
display of fireworks, one of the big-
gest and most spectacular exhibi-
tions ever held in the Willamette
valley. Some of the fire pictures
will be Spirit of the Train, Covered
Wagon, Pony Express, Chief Multi-
nomah, Indian Bear Hunt, Ameri-
can Emblem, American Flag and
others.

Two crack bands will play at
every performance and a new
loud speaker system has been in-
stalled, with dynamic speaker.
Some of the best horses in the
United States have arrived for the
show, including Bill McAdoo, U
Tell 'Em, Webfoot, Dusky Bell,
Monkey Wrench, No Wonder, Big

Enough, Suicide, Aimee McPherson
and about 100 others. There
also be about 28 wild steers, four
blooded Brahma steers, 20
ford calves, famous bucking Bu-
cow and three oxen.

Sixty Umatilla Indians, lead-
ing the famous redskin, Jim White,
now camped in Oregon City
many will participate in the event.
Free street parades in the dis-
tricts of Oregon City
be staged daily at 10:30. Dance
will be provided and the Ameri-
can Legion has secured 15 acres
parking space near the grounds.

Governor Patterson, Secretary
State Hoss, Lee Steiner, and
state officials as well as other
standing men of the state will
be guests of the rodeo. The govern-
or will dedicate the \$35,000 rodeo
grounds on the night of July 2.
