HENS LAY MORE AND BETTER EGGS

**Violet-ray Lamp is Recommended
For Chicken House**

Hens will not lay more eggs, they will be better eggs if a violet ray lamp is used in the chicken house according to reports of experiments recently completed in England.

Two groups of 12 pullets each, the same age and breeding, segregated for 16 weeks. Their eggs were identical. The first group in this time produced 124 eggs.

The second flock, given violet radiations for 10 minutes each produced 497 eggs, almost four times as many.

At the end of the 16 weeks two flocks were changed in the matter of electric light treatment, another period of the same length showed a complete reversal of results in which the second flock, which was being radiated had outdone the first group.

Further, says the report, from the pullets given the violet rays were found to contain more iron and calcium, making them a better food for human consumption.
