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**DAIRY FARM COST STUDY
BEGUN BY STATE COLLEGE**

A state-wide cost and economic study of the dairy industry, involving 500 dairy farms and extending over a period of two years, has been undertaken by the dairy and farm management departments of Oregon State college, working cooperatively.

This project, the most extensive of its kind ever conducted in the United States, will be carried on entirely with federal funds made available under the Purnell act.

Of the 500 farms involved 300 will be in the Willamette valley, 100 in the coast section, and 100 in eastern Oregon, in order to determine the economic importance of the industry in Oregon agriculture, and in what regions of the state, on the basis of comparative costs, prices and markets, the enterprise can most advantageously be encouraged and increased.

Costs of dairy farm production in the different regions and on the various types of dairy farms will also be studied to determine means of reducing costs to meet increasing competition.

FARM REMINDERS

Chicken mites thrive in warm weather. It is advisable to watch the roost connections, says the Oregon experiment station, and if any mites are present, to paint all connections and the bottoms of the roosts with a strong germicide or wood preservative. Crude oil is sometimes used, but has little lasting power, it is found.

Ladino clover pasture on the Wapato silty clay soil is being irrigated with a gravity ditch by the strip border method and is giving very good returns on the Oregon experiment station farm. A carrying capacity of over three cows to an acre is reported. The pasture is divided into three lots of four acres each for rotation grazing.

Although it is especially important that vegetables grown in Oregon for shipment to other states be standardized and graded carefully, it is almost equally important to observe proper grades and standards in growing vegetables for the canneries of the state, says the experiment station, as canned goods are bought on a close margin of grades. Careful grading even for the local markets has also been found to react to the benefit of the grower.

If plenty of range is available for the growing pullets, both the grain and mash can be fed in hoppers without danger of over-feeding, says the Oregon experiment station.

PREMIUM LIST OUT**

The Premium List of the Nineteenth Annual Pacific Livestock Show to be held October 26th to November 2, are being distributed. The total amount of prizes offered in all the departments amounts to approximately \$100,000. There is \$4500 worth for the Land Products department; \$1,000 Dairy Products Show; Boys and Girls Club Work, \$5,000 and judging contests of various types \$3250. There will also be the show of the American National Fox Breeders' Ass'n. with prizes aggregating several thousand dollars given by the association itself.

The Junior Agricultural activities of the Exposition will be taken care of by the J. C. Penny Hall. Which building was made possible through the generous gift of \$10,000 from J. C. Penny to which was added \$2500 from the West Coast Lumbermans Association which will be used in interior finishing of fir, cedar, hemlock and spruce.

HOME POINTERS

A convenient arrangement for spice cans, measuring cups and other small kitchen utensils is a set of narrow, open shelves near the work table. If they are painted a bright color which

harmonizes with the woodwork they will also add to the attractiveness of the room.

Crisp salads, fresh vegetables and fruits, with less meat and cereals, provide an attractive and satisfying diet for hot weather. Vegetables served raw are always best if crisp and cold. Allowing them to stand for a half hour in cold water before serving will accomplish this. Any left-overs, such as lettuce, cabbage or celery, if placed in a tightly closed container, will retain their crispness for several days.

**"DEPARTMENT STORES
OF FINANCE"**

Banks in the larger cities of the United States are rapidly becoming "department stores of finance." Through expansions into all financial fields, the larger banks are approaching the stage when they may boast that they are prepared to serve the public in any financial capacity.

Safe-keeping of money was the bank's first function. Now it encourages its patrons to save systematically, makes loans that help develop communities, acts as escrow agent in real estate transactions and fulfills many other important functions. The latest trend in this broadening service has cropped out in various large cities where banks have, through creation of investment arms, purchased seats on stock exchanges and buy and sell orders in stocks for patrons.

The most recent example has appeared in Southern California where five major banks have purchased seats in the Los Angeles Stock Exchange, while four have obtained seats on the Los Angeles curb exchange. A stock exchange seat in Los Angeles sells for \$150,000 while a curb membership can be bought for \$8,000. The incident not only demonstrates the more comprehensive service provided by modern banks, but it also shows the faith of those banks in the future and stability of a modern stock exchange.

One large company has acquired some 50 nationally known, non-competitive food specialties. Other companies plan projects of a similar nature.

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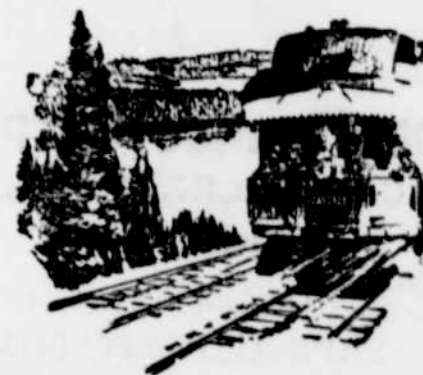
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
