Washington County Leads in Number of Potato Growers

Washington County again leads the Oregon counties with the largest number of potato growers engaged in producing certified seed potatoes in 1929, according to a report of County Agent O. T. McWhorter. Forty per cent of the certified Burbanks of the United States were produced in Washington County in 1928. The county also had more certified seed potato growers than all other Oregon counties for that year. Forty-two growers were rated as producing Certified Burbanks this year by the Potato Certification Board of Oregon Agricultural College, while seven growers were given the "Standard" rating. Three grew Certified Netted Gems, and one the Standard grade. One grower grew Certified American Wonder, and two Pride of Multnomah variety. One grower has British Queen potatoes passing the two field inspections as certified and the bin inspection is yet to be completed. "Certified" and "Standard" are terms applied to degrees of perfection attained by growers of potatoes who are improving quality and production of the potato crop by rigorous selection of seed stock thru which process the degenerate diseases of potatoes are reduced to a minimum. During the growing season two field inspections of potatoes are made by the inspectors working for the potato certification board at which time the disease percentage is determined. The third inspection is made after digging time. Potatoes in the certified grade must show a total of not over 5 per cent of any extreme virus disease and with a total of fifteen per cent of all disease contained.
