**Holstein Breeders Meet to Plan Showing for Fair**

Frank W. Connell was re-elected president of the Washington County Holstein association at a meeting in the Hillsboro chamber of commerce rooms Friday, February 7. Earle Jossy of the Rock Creek Golf Club was awarded the 4-H club summer school scholarship offered by the association for the club year of 1929. Other officers elected were A. J. Evers, vice-president; W. F. Cyrus, secretary; F. H. Jossy, and Walter Lindow, directors.

The system of herd classification now being used by the American Holstein association is proving a very satisfactory means of herd improvement said H. A. Mathiesen, field representative of the association. He briefly outlined the method being used and stated that the breeders who have had their stock classified have expressed themselves as being satisfied with the gradings given the animals in their herds.

The 4-H scholarship will not be given for the year 1930. Instead the county Holstein group will give one dollar to every boy or girl in the county who brings a worthy purebred Holstein animal to the county fair.

The scholarship for work done in 1929 was awarded to Earle Jossy because of his activity in his club, his personal achievements in his work, his records and his part in the achievements of his club. Earle was secretary of his group which made a 100 per cent record of completions, he was a member of the stock judging team that represented the county at the state fair and won prizes on his calf in both the open class and the club class for Holstein cattle at the county fair.

**Census Report for Absent Families**

The Census Bureau is making special provision for enumeration of families planning to be away from home during the month of April.

The Fifteenth Decennial Census of the United States will be taken during the month of April. The enumeration will be made by a force of about 100,000 enumerators who will go from house to house and secure the information required for the census. Every person is to be enumerated, so far as possible, at his "usual place of abode" or the place where he usually lives. Where individual members of a family are away from home at the time the census is taken they will be reported to the enumerator by other members of the family.

For cases where it is known in advance that the whole family will be away from home at that time, special provision has been made by the Director of the Census in the form of an absent family schedule which is to be filled out by some responsible member of the family in advance of the census date and transmitted to the local Supervisor of the Census. A copy of this schedule can be secured by application to Fred S. Perrine of Oregon City, Oregon, who is the Census Supervisor for this district.

Families planning to be away during the month of April, leaving the home closed or with no one in charge who is qualified to give the census information to the enumerator, are urged to obtain one of these schedules at once and to fill it out and send it to Mr. Perrine, at the earliest possible date. Or if the house is left in charge of a servant who will be sure to be at home when the enumerator calls, the schedule may be left with such servant for delivery to the enumerator. The information furnished on this schedule will be treated as confidential and will be used only for the tabulation of statistics which will not reveal any information with regard to individuals or families.

**Couple Narrowly Escape From Death**
