EUROPEAN TRIP BEING AWARDED AS GRAND PRIZE

University of Oregon, Eugene, Feb.
—(Special) High schools throughout
the state are expected to participate
in the competition for the best paper
on the Paris Pact, a project under
the auspices of the National Student
Forum, it is announced here by
President Arnold Bennett Hall, who
is head of the committee for Ore-
gon. A committee of 19 educational
leaders of the state to serve with
him has been selected by Dr. Hall
to assist with the contest.

The committee includes Charles A.
Rice, superintendent of schools of
Portland; Hopkins Jenkins, principal
of Jefferson High School; G. E.
Finnerty, Albany; George A. Bris-
coe, Ashland; G. W. Ager, Bend;
Mrs. Martha E. Mulkey, Coquille;
H. W. Adams, Corvallis; R. R.
Turner, Dallas; H. R. Goold, Eu-
gene; John Francis Cramer, Grants
Pass; Paul T. Jackson, Klamath
Falls; E. D. Towler, La Grande; W.
N. Byars, Odell; J. L. Turnbull,
Ontario; R. W. Kirk, Oregon City;
Austin Landreth, Pendleton; John
C. Johnson, Prineville; C. W. Boet-
ticher, The Dalles; and Frank B.
Bennett, Tillamook.

Awards for papers dealing with the
Paris Pact will include one for the
best in each high school, the
best in the state, and for the grand
prize a vacation trip to Europe.

The purpose of the contest is to
encourage independent, thoughtful
discussion of all aspects of the pact,
and this is declared to be the aim
of the student forum. No attempt
is made to influence students for or
against the international project.

"Those who take seriously the du-
ties and obligations of democracy
could not help but feel the impor-
tance of training our young people
in this attitude of mind and habit
of thought towards the problems
which as voters they ultimately must
face and solve," said Dr. Hall.

Papers should be in by March 15,
and the state award will be announ-
ced April 15. The National award
of the trip to Europe will be an-
nounced May 1, 1930.

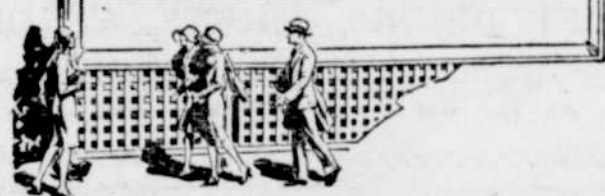
