**Advancement of Poultry Business to be Discussed at Meeting July 23, 24**

Demonstrations and exhibits showing the modern trend and developments in the poultry business will be featured at the Oregon poultrymen's meeting at the Oregon Agricultural college, Corvallis, July 23 and 24. Several local poultry keepers are planning on attending this meeting.

The new modern poultry plant which has just been completed will be open for inspection on this date.  
 Battery brooders, all kinds of electrical equipment, methods of handling various poultry diseases and demonstrations showing the good and poor types of birds and their characteristics will be shown. Feeding problems and methods of operating the poultry plant economically will be discussed. Throughout this meeting the poultrymen will have an opportunity of participating in the program and their particular problems will be discussed.

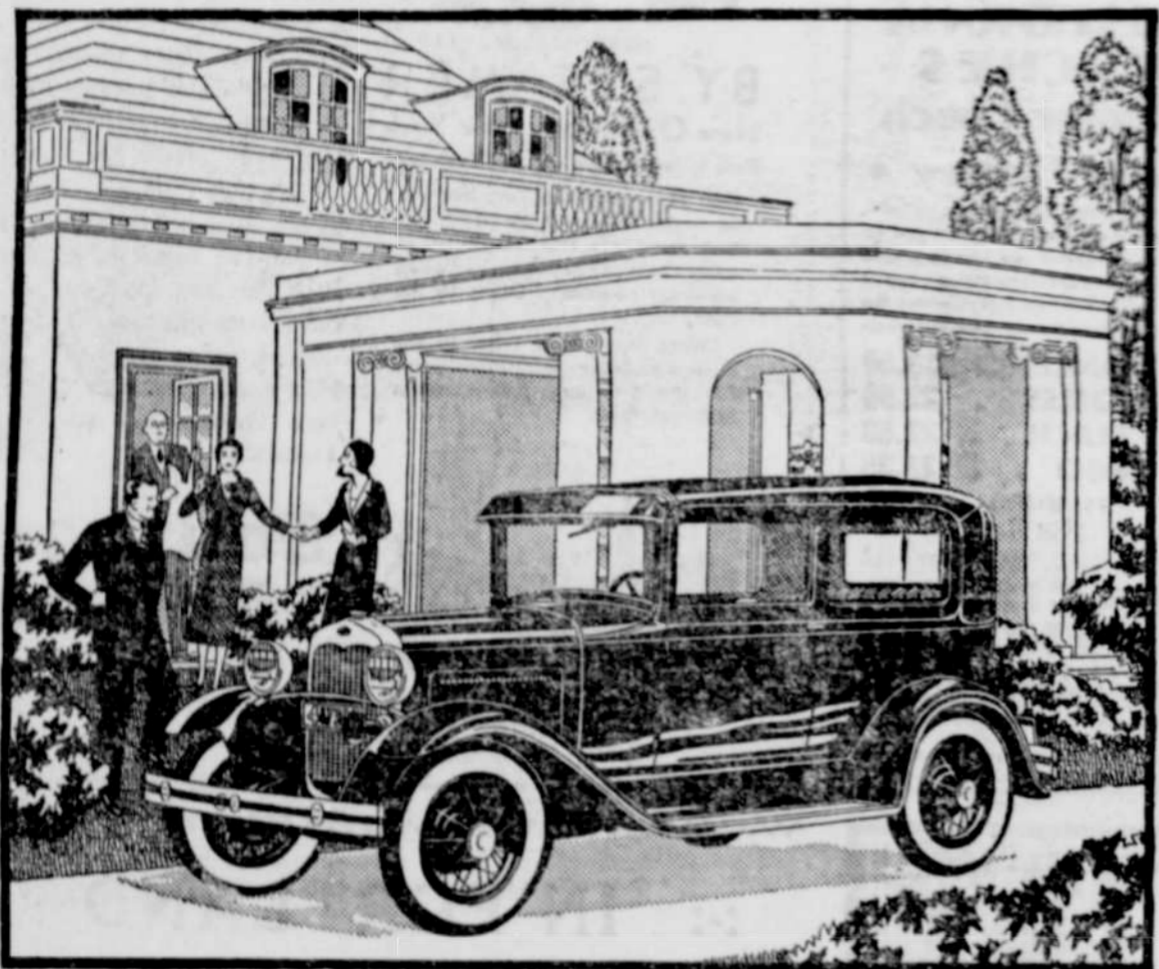
