They say trouble never comes singly and it seems true as Cal Olson is very ill at his home.

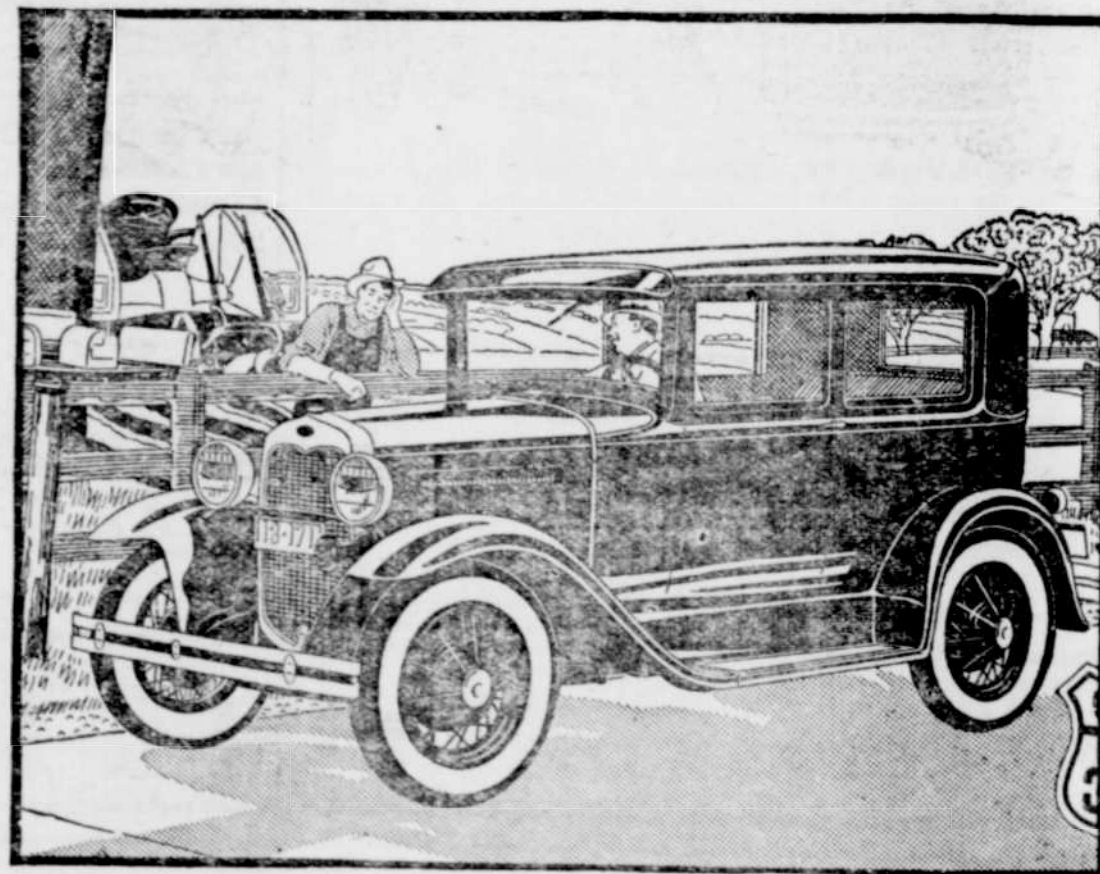
Mr. and Mrs. E. D. Hite and daughter spent several days visiting with the Wm. F. Campbell family at Hummel Wash.
