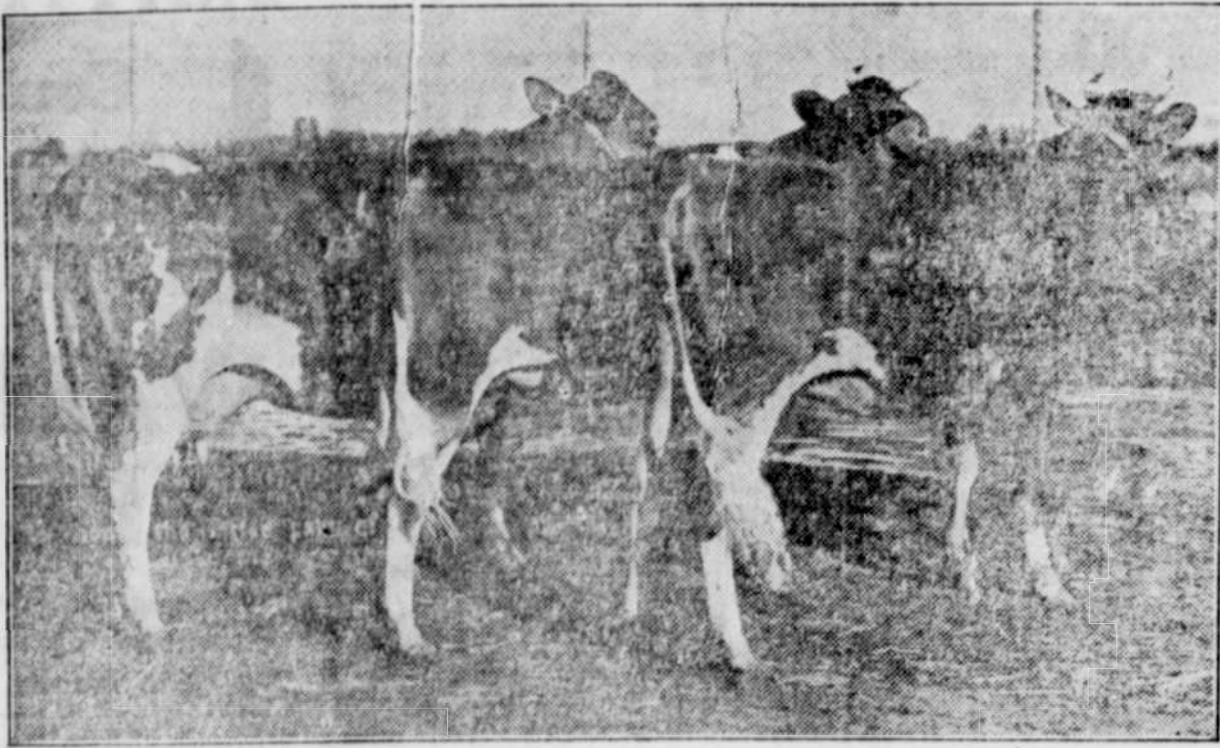


Three Prize Winners at State Fair
