HOOVER IS CHAIRMAN OF BICENTENNIAL COMMISSION

The George Washington bicentennial Commission is a Federal body created by Congress to formulate and execute plans for the Celebration of the Two Hundredth Anniversary of the Birth of George Washington in 1932. In glancing at the personnel of this Commission, it will become obvious that Congress, in making its appointments was actuated by no other motive than procuring the highest type of men and women to serve on this Commission. Party affiliations or places of residence had no consideration whatsoever in their selection. The George Washington Bicentennial Commission is composed as follows:

The President of the United States Chairman; the Vice-president of the United States and Speaker of the House of Representatives; Senator Simeon D. Fess Vice-Chairman; Senators Arthur Capper of Kansas, and Carter Glass of Virginia, Representatives Willis C. Hawley, of Oregon, John Q. Tilson of Connecticut, Joseph W. Byrnes, of Tennessee and R. Walton Moore of Virginia. There are eight Presidential Commissioners: Mrs. John Dickson Sherman, Colorado; Mrs. Anthony Wayne Cooke, Pennsylvania; Henry Ford Michigan; George Eastman New York; C. Bascom Sloop, Virginia; Wallace McCamant, Oregon; Albert Bushnell Hart, Massachusetts and Bernard M. Baruch, of New York.

FARM GROUPS JOIN IN SCIENCE SCHOOL

Men Interested in Hops, Seeds, and Irrigated Pastures to Hold SPECIAL SESSIONS

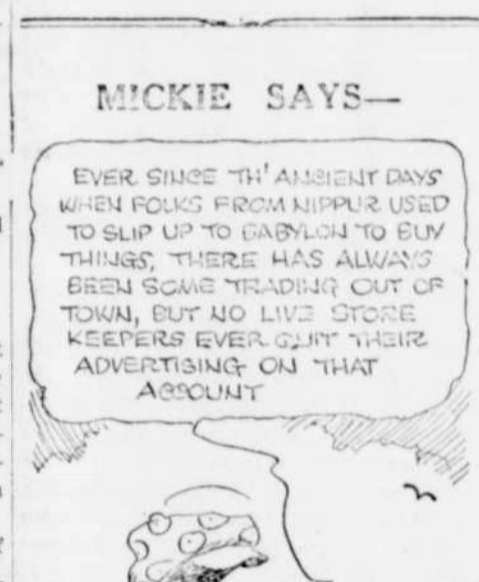
Conferences of three significant farm groups are scheduled to be held during the Farm Science Short course at Oregon State college January 26 to 31 according to announcement by G. R. Hyslop, chief in farm crops and committee chairman. The first gathering will be that of

the hop growers, Monday afternoon. Farmers particularly interested in irrigation and pastures will have a special session occupying all of Tuesday and part of Wednesday. A regular meeting of the Oregon Seed council will be held Wednesday and Thursday.

In addition to 118 lectures and demonstrations to be given by the college faculty during the week, W. J. Spillman, chief agricultural economist of the division of farm management and costs, U. S. D. A., is coming from the national capital to take part in this state-wide school for farmers. Dr. Spillman is recognized as one of the country's outstanding authorities on farm management as well as plant breeding.

OUR COUNTRY DAY BY DAY

"THE REBELLIOUS STRIPES"

When Washington was appointed to command the United Armies of the Colonies in that first great struggle which we, as Americans, encountered, he realized that one of the first things that was necessary was some uniform standard by which the eager men from every section of the thirteen colonies would recognize their fellow fighters.

Accordingly, on January 2, 1776, without any formal act of Congress, the first American colors were raised over the headquarters of the American army at Cambridge, Mass.

This first flag bore seven red and six white stripes and retained the canton of England, a blue field crossed with red and white crosses of St. George and St. James. It at once became the flag of the united colonies. The English called the new standard "The Rebellious Stripes."

Six months after the Cambridge flag was raised Congress adopted the Declaration of Independence, and as soon as this was done there was no longer any reason for the sign of the English "union"—referring to the canton—being kept in the American flag.

In fact, even before the official Declaration of Independence, so the Betsy Ross version of the flag goes, Washington had contemplated the "Starry or Constellation Flag."
