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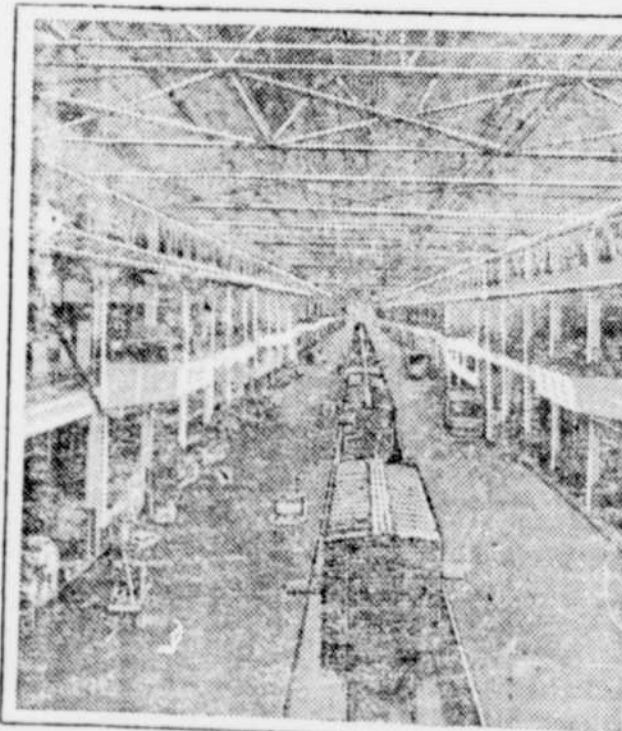
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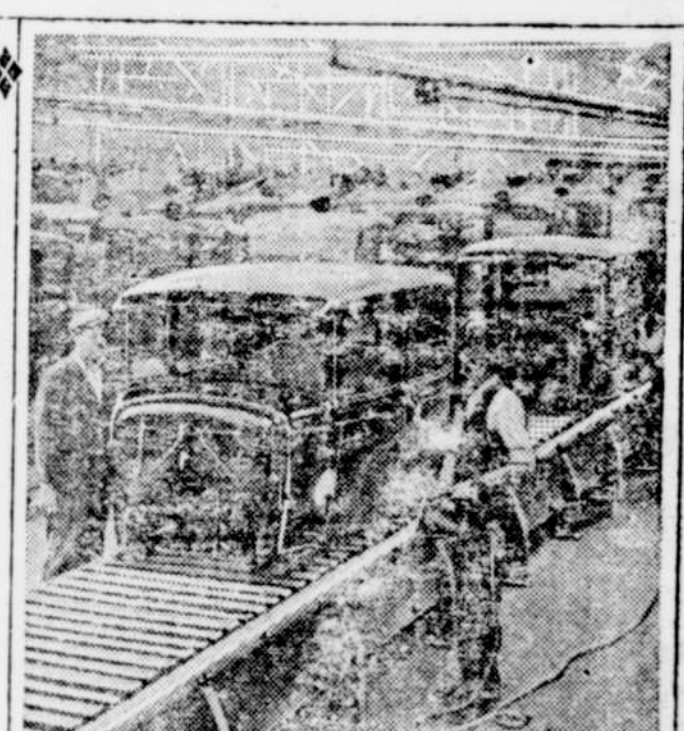
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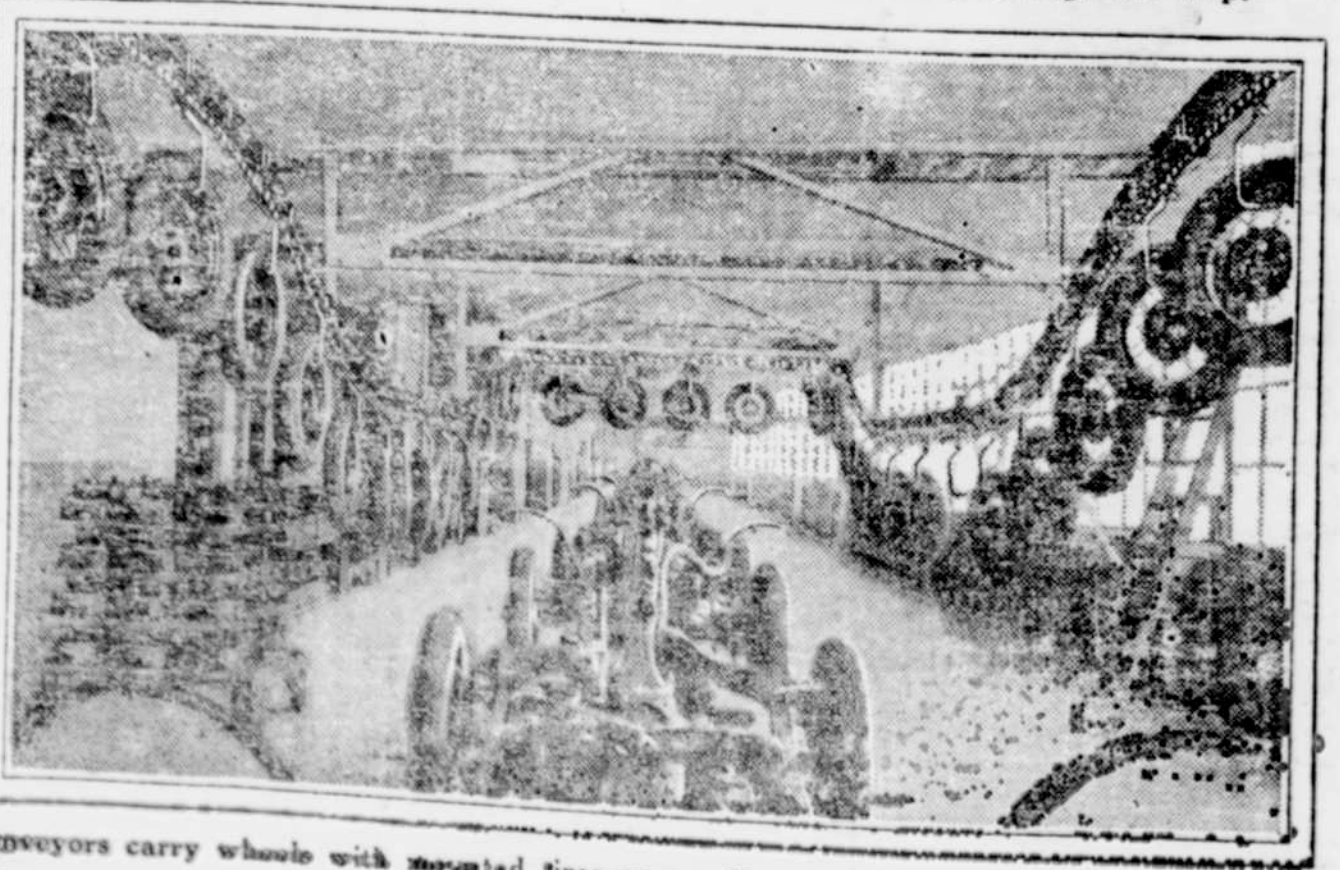
Conveyors Carry Ford Car Parts

Conveyors carry wheels with mounted tires over a line of cars which are being assembled. The third step in the assembly process is to bring wheels to the chassis. As indicated in the picture, an automatic flow of wheels around the car is shown. As a chassis enters the section, wheels, in groups of four, each take a wheel from the line and fasten it to the chassis.
