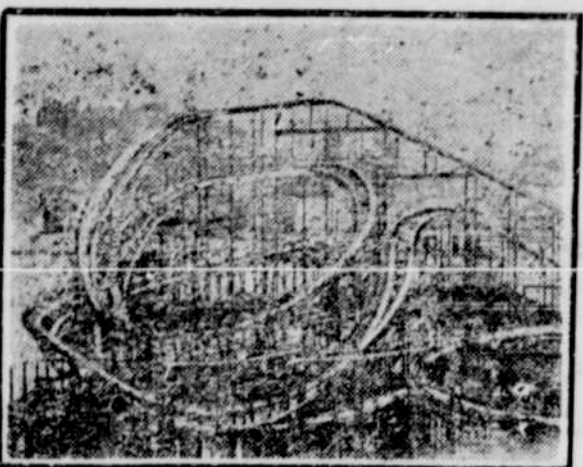
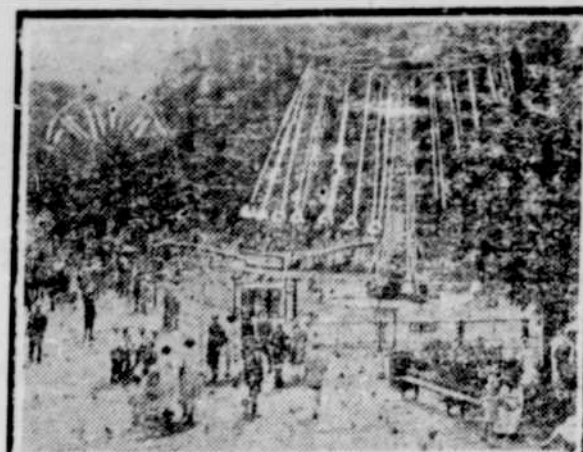
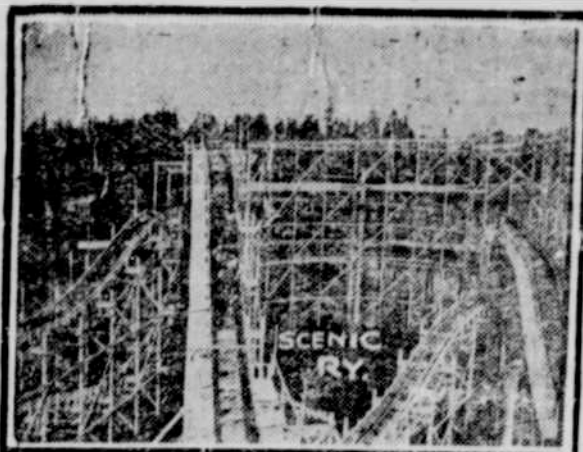

President Hoover has decided that individual Federal income tax returns should be made available to the states which have income tax laws, and he has accordingly issued an order to this effect.
