farther back into the mountains to gather the bark. Second, the supply has been decidedly variable, changing excessively as stimulated by sudden fluctuations in price.

"By figuring the average price paid for the dry bark during the past few years at about 8 cents per pound, it is seen that the industry brings to the people of the west coast a revenue that runs well into the thousands of dollars annually. Perpetuation of this industry seems, therefore desirable. Proper procedure should be taken to keep it from facing extinction as has been the case with some of our industries which have depended on natural resources.

"To meet the demands for bark more conservative methods must be used in peeling and the possibilities of growing cascara under cultivation should be considered. How the cascara tree will grow under cultivation however, has been determined only to a limited extent. In the last analysis, the matter of growing cascara will depend on whether it is profitable. On the right sites, the growing of this tree will probably bring in greater returns than commercial timber growing.

Health and Beauty

DR. SOPHIA BRUNSON

Stimulants

"The most common stimulants are alcohol, tobacco, tea and coffee. You see, Bob, I've been doing some reading, since I went to my doctor.

"Now, Irving Fisher, who is an authority on health subjects says: 'Enough poisons are manufactured within the body without taking in extra one from without.' He tells us that the best rule for those who wish to attain the highest physical and mental efficiency is total abstinence from all substances which contain poisons; including spirits, wine, beer, tobacco, many much advertised patent drinks, served at soda fountains, most patent medicines and even coffee and tea.

"That is shaving it down pretty close, John; and you used to drink several cocktails a day, and drink three cups of coffee. Are you quitting them all?"

"Well, I've read so much by scientists, especially on alcohol, that I have about decided to eliminate that altogether. I have found out that alcohol is most deceptive. Instead of a stimulant, it is really a narcotic. When a person who indulges much in alcohol gets sick he hasn't the resistance that characterizes an abstainer. If he has pneumonia, he usually fights a losing battle. The white blood cells have lost much of their ability to resist infection.

"Life insurance companies regard even moderate drinkers as poor risks. Dr. Stockard made many experiments with alcohol on mice. When they reproduced at all, the progeny were very inferior. Many scientists believe that parents who are addicted to the use of alcohol damage their offspring. You know Bob, a fellow would hate to have a defective child, and know that his bibulous habits had been the cause of it."

"How about tobacco, John, have you been reading much on that subject also?"

"Yes, I have. There is no doubt about tobacco being a poison. Its effects, like all other toxins, is more detrimental to some people than to others. At any rate the athletic trainer has found that the use of tobacco lessens physical fitness. This is denied by ordinary smokers, because they are unconscious of it. But that is no evidence that it is not injurious for many diseases come on so insidiously that the victims are not aware of them until they have reached the incurable stage. A tooth may give no evidence of decay until the nerve is exposed and then its about gone.

"It was found out in a well-known college that those who abstained from tobacco during the college course, had outstripped the users of tobacco in weight, height, growth of chest and lung capacity. Prof. Pack, of the University of Utah, finds that tobacco-using athletes are distinctly inferior to those who abstain. Most findings of scientists on the subject of tobacco using, are practically in agreement.

"Experiments on animals really does induce arterial changes. I don't want arterio-sclerosis or high blood pressure, so I have concluded to cut my smoking down to a minimum for I don't know whether I have will power to quit or not. But if I had possessed this information when I was a youth, I certainly would not have begun the habit for to say the least it is expensive and tends to cause unpleasant breath."

Sarah Anne's Cooking Class

Pickle time is when cucumbers, pepper and tomatoes are so plentiful. Why not convert your surplus vegetables into pickles. They are an aid to digestion, in addition to which they serve as a spicy flavoring for some of less distinctive ones. These recipes are tested and are not difficult to make.

Tomato Catsup

1 peck tomatoes,
1/2 gallon vinegar,
3 onions,
1 teaspoon mace,
2 tablespoons cloves,
2 tablespoons cinnamon,
1 teaspoon spice.
Sugar and salt to taste.
Slice tomatoes and onions, add a pint of water, boil until soft, mash through a sieve, then add vinegar, mace, cloves, cinnamon, spice, sugar and salt.
Boil until thick, pour into bottle and seal.

Pepper Hash

2 dozen red peppers,
1 quart vinegar,
3 cups sugar,
6 onions,
Remove the white fibre and the seeds from the peppers and peel the onions. Chop finely, then pour boiling water over them. Let stand 5 minutes and drain. Cook together the vinegar, sugar and salt, add the peppers and onions, boil up once. Put in sterilized jars and seal closely.

Cucumber Catsup

Pare very thinly 6 large cucumbers, chop finely, add a scant tablespoon of salt and let drain in a colander for an hour or two. Add a large onion, chopped fine, one tablespoon of white pepper and a pint of vinegar. Stir thoroughly and seal in a glass jar. Let stand at least a month before using.

This keeps well and retains the flavor of the fresh cucumber so perfectly that those who like the vegetable are sure to like the catsup.

Pimento Sandwich Spread

1 peck red bell peppers,
1 pint vinegar,
1 pint sugar,
4 tablespoons flour (rounded)
1 jar prepared mustard,
1 teaspoon salt.

Remove the white fibre and the seeds from the peppers. Stir all ingredients together except the mustard. Cook until thick; about 15 minutes. Put mustard in just before taking it up. Pour into jar and cover with paraffin. This will keep several months.

Relish

Select large bell peppers half green and half red, remove seed and fibre. Put through the food chopper. Use green tomatoes and onions measuring each after they have been thru the food chopper. Use half as much tomatoes as peppers, half as many onions as tomatoes. Mix well, salt generously put in a bag and drip over night. Next morning put vegetables in a porcelain vessel and cover with sweetened and spiced vinegar. To each 1/2 gallon of vinegar, put 3 cups of sugar and one-half teaspoons each of cinnamon, allspice, cloves, nutmeg, turmeric and black pepper. Mix thoroughly by stirring boil five minutes. Fill sterilized jars and seal.
