Parents Urged to Regard Children's Needs

Dear Girls:

It is a great pity that some parents refuse to recognize progress and imagine that they can treat their children today just as the girls and boys of fifty or a hundred years ago were treated.

Every now and then I get a letter from some girl whose parents refuse to let her have dates with boys and keep her tied to their apron strings until she is too old to have a good time. The invariable result of such treatment is either one or two things. The girls, no matter how much she loves her parents, will long so desperately for companionship with her own age that she will deceive her parents and meet undesirable company on the sly and in objectionable places or she will become a sour old maid, who has no one to live for after her parents are gone.

Unless these parents are absolutely blind they must understand that every normal girl of sixteen or seventeen craves the companionship of girls and boys of her own age. They should do everything in their power to make this companionship wholesome and enjoyable. They should encourage the girls and boys of the neighborhood to come to their home and should allow their daughter some liberty. If we fail to let our girls understand that we trust them, we are doing them a grave in-

justice and putting a doubt as to their behavior in their own minds.

So many unhappy marriages have been entered into by girls who have been held down by their parents and allowed no liberty. They reach such a mental state that any rascal who comes along and urges them to run away is eagerly accepted as a means of getting a little freedom.

The girl who has the opportunity of knowing lots of boys in a friendly way is much more capable of judging the upright from the good-for-nothing. She doesn't jump at the first chance she has of getting married if she is having a pleasant time with a group of young friends.

I certainly do not mean by this that young girls should do as they please and run wild—coming in at all hours of the night from places of which their parents are in ignorance.

But unless parents are deliberately trying to wreck their children's happiness and their chances for a successful life they will not only allow them a certain amount of freedom but they will encourage them to find wholesome companionship with young people of their own age, and will make their homes as pleasant as possible in order to attract desirable young visitors.

After all, most modern parents are anxious to do the best thing for our children and unless we make them happy we fail miserably.
