Why Not Punish the Big Criminal

Dear Girls:

One of the greatest faults of our government or in fact, any government, today, is the leniency accorded the big criminal while the little fellow gets the jail sentence. It has almost reached the point where if one's crime is on a large enough scale he goes scot free.

This is particularly noticeable in the enforcement of the prohibition law. The big bootlegger in any county is usually known to at least half the population, but is he apprehended and made to serve a jail sentence.

I should say not, but on the criminal docket you will find plenty of the little fellows. There will be fellows from the hotels and people who are found with a quart or a pint on their person or in their cars. And take this matter of stealing. 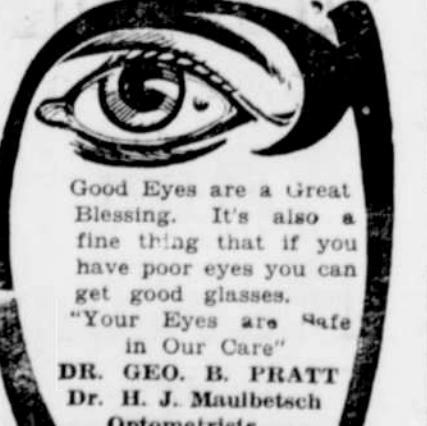
