IN OREGON HOMES

EUGENE—"Live in plenty" is the idea portrayed in a recent exhibit of vegetables grown by Lane county homemakers who cooperated in the year-around garden project of the home economics extension service. Out of a huge "horn of plenty" poured spinach, peppers, turnip, egg plant, beans and other fresh vegetables. On a ledge just below were displayed canned and dried foods preserved by these women. Canned vegetables prepared ready for serving to the baby were featured. Planting plans and recipes using these vegetables were shown and made available. The display was arranged by Gertrude Skow, home demonstration agent, in cooperation with the First National Bank of Eugene.

ST. HELENS—Eighteen home economics extension units, eleven of them officially organized with constitutions and by-laws, are active in the home economics work of Columbia county. This report comes from Sara V. Case, home demonstration agent who says she has 475 women on her active mailing list for notices and other helpful home-making information sent out from her office.

CORVALLIS—"Solving the lid problem" is the name of an illustrated mimeographed sheet prepared by Zelta F. Rodenwold, extension economist in home management. This leaflet contains drawings and directions for making three convenient, easily constructed lid racks. It was prepared as a supplement to one of a series of discussions on "Storage Ideas" given by Mrs. Rodenwold over station KOAC each Tuesday morning at 10:30 o'clock. The mimeograph HE 227, will be sent free upon request.

OREGON CITY—Eighty-five dresses were remodeled by Clackamas county women enrolled last spring and summer in the clothing project called the "Use of Commercial Patterns." The total value of the dresses before they were made over was estimated at \$190.15. After the remodeling the garments were valued at \$436.65, or a net gain of \$246.47. The project was supervised by Thelma Gaylord, the county home emonstration agent.
