

Sarah Anne's Cooking Class

Eggs should be used freely at all seasons, they rank exceedingly high among the body building foods. Probably no other single article of food can be made use of in a greater variety of dishes. They are easily and quickly prepared and may be served at any meal.

Spanish Omelet

2 tablespoons cooking oil, 1 green pepper, clove of garlic, 1/2 cup sliced canned, 1 small onion.

Cut the garlic crosswise and rub the frying pan well with the cut surface. Then heat the cooking oil. Add the chopped onion and green pepper and cook for 5 minutes. Scald and peel the tomatoes, cut in slices and add with mushrooms to the onions and pepper. Cover the pan and simmer 20 minutes. Season with salt and pepper. Spread over a five-egg omelet, fold and turn out on a hot platter. Serve hot.

Stuffed Eggs

4 hard cooked eggs, 2 teaspoons anchovy paste, 1-2 cup tomato catsup, 8 rounds of toast, salt, pepper, paprika.

Cut hard boiled eggs in half lengthwise. Remove yolk and mix well with anchovy paste, salt, pepper, and paprika. Refill whites. Place on toast and cover with tomato catsup.

Eggs au Gratin

Poach one egg for each person. Arrange the poached eggs in a shallow, buttered dish and sprinkle with grated cheese. Pour over this white sauce. Cover with buttered bread crumbs and brown in oven.

Creamed Eggs

1-4 pound pimento cheese grated 6 hard boiled eggs, 6 slices toast, 3 tablespoons butter, 3 tablespoons flour, 1-2 cups milk, salt, chopped parsley.

Melt the butter, add flour and salt, stir until well blended, add milk slowly and cook well. Add pimento cheese, beat until smooth. Arrange slices of toast in a hot platter, pour a little sauce on each piece. Cut eggs in half and place on toast, allowing one egg for each slice of toast. Pour over the rest of sauce, sprinkle with parsley. Serve at once.
