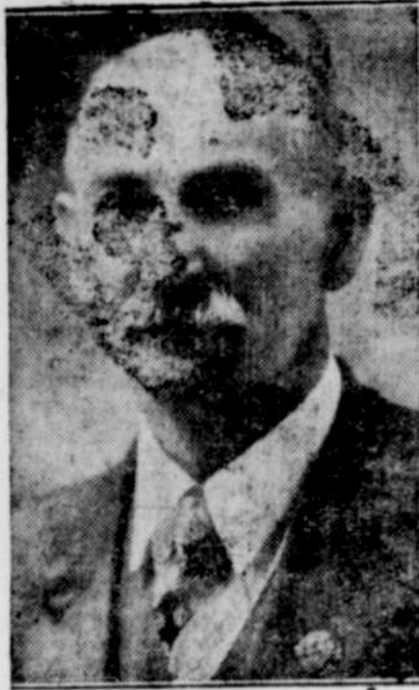


Mr. and Mrs. W. R. Van Kleeve were dinner guests at the J. C. Snyder home at Kinton Thursday evening of last week.

Judge Henry J. Beans Seeks Re-Election

Henry J. Bean, present Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, of Oregon, was born November 13, 1853, at Bethel, Maine; married June 18, 1886, to Mattie E. Magahey; two children graduates of University of Oregon. Judge Bean was educated in the schools of Maine, where he read law and was admitted to the Bar of that state March 9, 1881, came to Oregon the same year, and settled at Pendleton, where he practiced his profession until elected circuit judge of the Sixth Judicial District, comprising Umatilla and Morrow Counties, in 1906. He was city attorney of Pendleton and city recorder for two years, county judge of Umatilla county, 1904-1906; was elected Justice of the Supreme Court in 1910 and has been re-elected each election since that date.

On January 23, 1932, the Oregon Voter said of Judge Bean: "A faithful, honorable servant of the people with long experience in and knowledge of the law and what amounts to an uncanny sense of justice in its unerring penetration to the real merits of each case as it comes before him. A modest, kindly gentleman, who deserves better from the commonwealth to which he has given a life-time of service than to

be kicked out in the cold, whose physical condition and mental vigor make it possible for him to continue rendering useful service if re-elected, and whose experience imparts a ripeness and maturity to his judgment such as no young man may hope to equal."

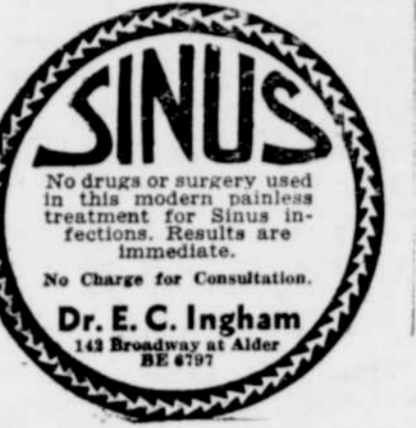

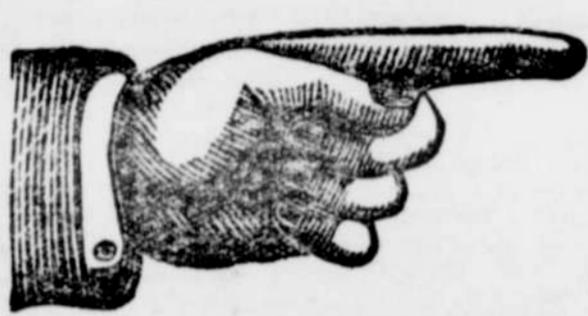
