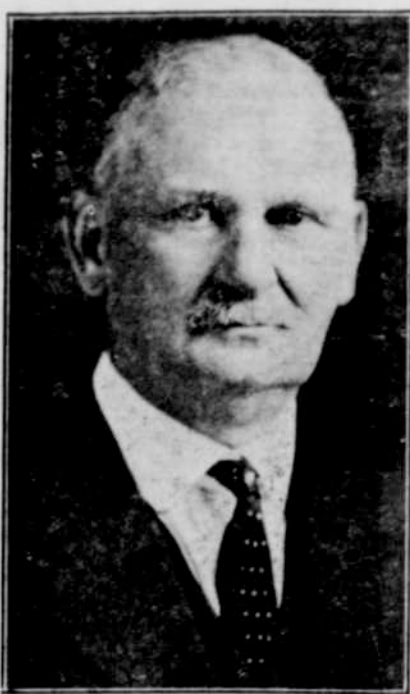

Mrs. A. G. Ollinger, of Reedville, was a Saturday visitor in Aloha.

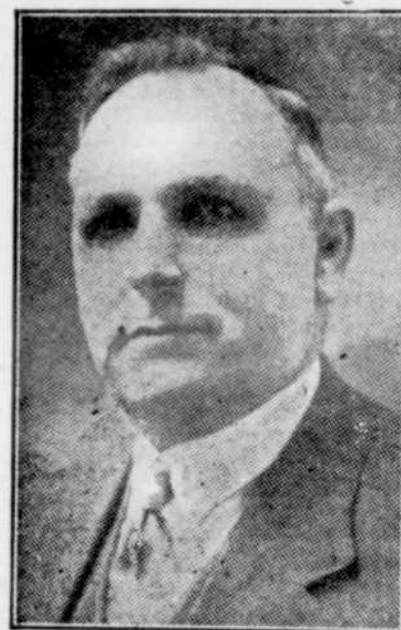
Mrs. C. L. Roy has closed her restaurant.

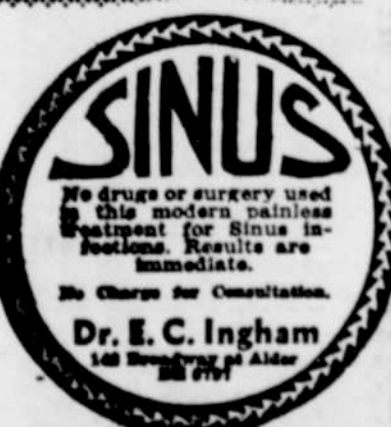
