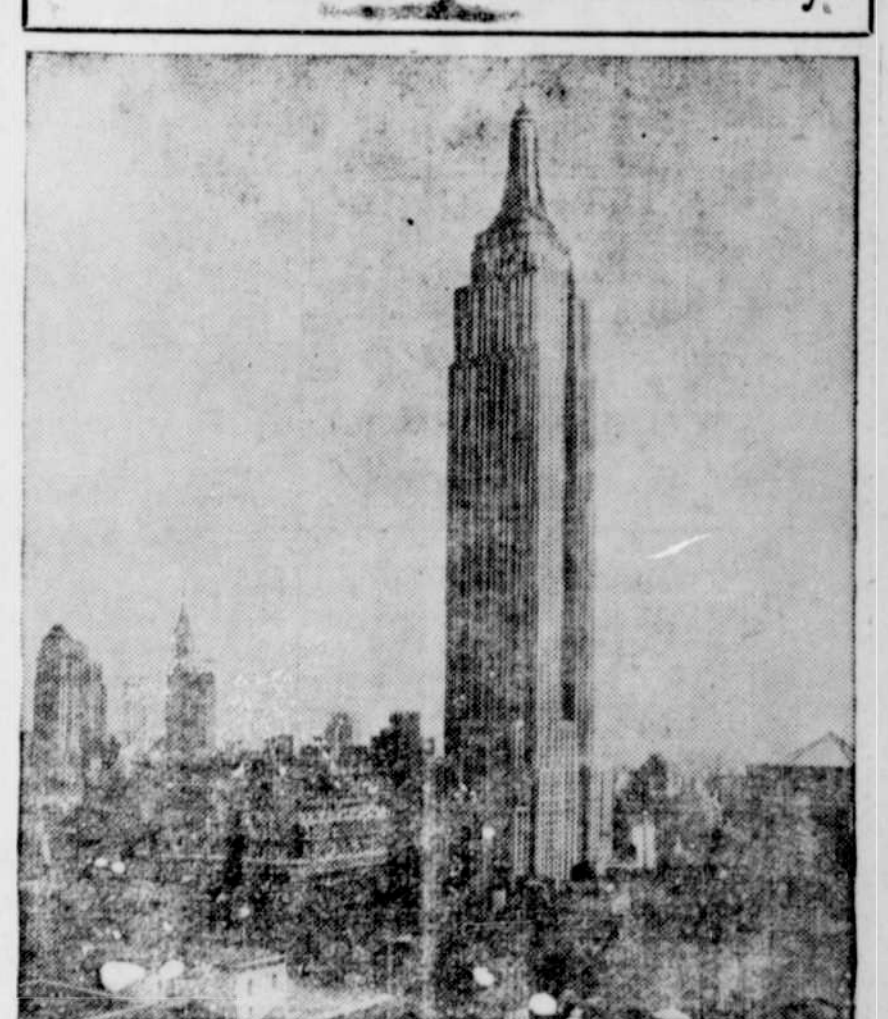

Out of Test Tube Came an Industry



Imagine ten buildings like this, each one 102 stories high, packed solid
with fresh yeast! That much yeast has actually been grown from one
small test tube since Charles Fleischmann sailed from Europe with it
in his vest pocket in 1868.

SIXTY-FOUR years ago Charles
Fleischmann was en route from
Austria to the United States. In his
pocket he carried a small test tube
filled with tiny living plants. With his
brother, Maximilian, he was bound for
Cincinnati.

Out of that test tube came the yeast
industry. Some idea of its growth can
be had when it is known that fourteen
Fleischmann factories scattered through-
out the United States recently completed
the growing of the two billionth pound
of yeast. Part of this mass went into
small cakes of yeast sold in grocery
stores, drug stores and in restaurants.

The rest of the immense bulk of yeast
was mainly used by bakers for bread
and sweet goods.
