Campaign Notes

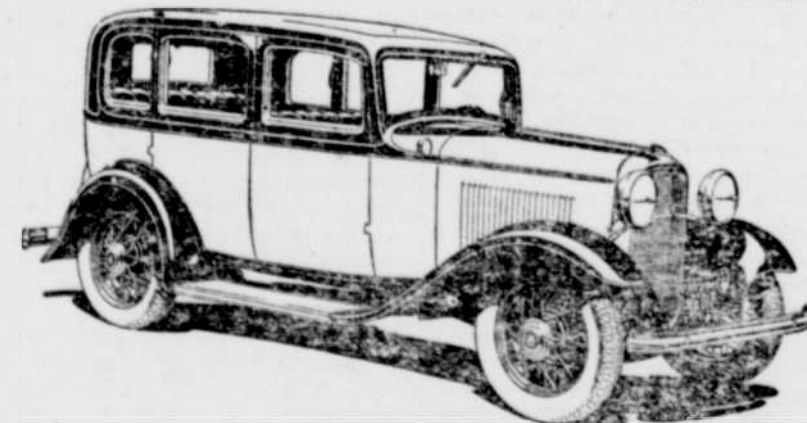
